

Ship Montpelier 1840
Friday June the 26th

Commences with rugged weather Middle
and latter part fine weather; headed to the N. employed
making casks thus ends Lat 22,43 No Obs

Saturday June the 27th

Commences with fine weather and
light airs at S E At 3 P.M. spoke with the Ship Huntress
Middle and latter part the same headed to the S
and sail in sight employed making casks, so ends Lat 22,5
Long 109,50

Sunday June the 28th

Commences with light airs at S E
and fine pleasant weather; one sail in sight, Middle
part the same, latter part a fine breeze, headed to the S
saw several finbacks; so ends Lat 22,44

Monday June the 29th

Commences with a fine breeze at S E and
pleasant weather; Saw a Ship steering to the N. with
a press of sail, Middle and latter part the same
at 7 P.M. saw sperm Whales, lowered and struck
one Ship in sight, so ends Lat 22,34

Tuesday June the 30th

Commences with fine weather at
1 P.M. took the Whale a long side, and commenced cutting
at dark finished cutting; latter part strong breeze and
rain squalls, employed in boiling, so ends; No Obs

Wednesday July the 1st 1840

Commences with thick rainey weather
and very rugged Middle and latter clear weather with
strong gales, at 1 P.M. finished boiling; so ends Lat 22,05

Ship Montpelier July 1840
Thursday July the 2nd

Commences with clear weather and strong
gales at S E, headed to the S Middle part much the same
latter part fine weather, employed in stowing down
2 Ships in sight thus ends; Lat 22,40, Long 109,11

Friday July the 3rd

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather
At 2 P.M. finished stowing down and spoke the Ship
Clarkson, Chase Montpelier 12,00 lbs, at 3 spoke the
Maria Micheli, Maclear, Montpelier 10,00 lbs, so ends Lat
22,50

Saturday July the 4th

Commences with fine weather and
a brisk breeze at S E, Middle and latter part the same
at 10 P.M. spoke the Huntress and celebrated the fourth of
July, headed to the S, thus ends Lat 22,14 Long 109,12

Sunday July the 5th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather
and light airs at S E, headed to the S saw several fine
backs, one sail in sight, thus ends Lat 22,37

Monday July the 6th

Commences with fine weather and light
airs at E; Middle part the same, latter part a brisk breeze
at 1 P.M. and thick overcast weather headed to the
Eastward, no Ships in sight, thus ends, Lat 20,59

Tuesday July the 7th

Commences with a moderate breeze at
North and overcast weather latter part a strong
gale, lay by headed to the N so ends Lat 23,36
