

Ship Montpelier on the West Coast of New Holland 1841

Monday January the 25th

All this 24 hours strong winds and rugged weather, headed to the S. saw nothing, employed in Ship duty, so ends
Lat 28.10, Long 108.34

Tuesday January the 26th

All this 24 hours strong breezes at S.E. and pleasant weather, headed S.E. saw nothing employed in Ship duty, so ends. Lat 28.34 Long 107.19 E

Wednesday January the 27th

All this 24 hours strong winds at S.E. and rugged weather, headed S.E. saw nothing employed in Ship duty, so ends
Lat 28.26 Long 108.56 E

Thursday January the 28th

Commenced with a strong wind at S.E. and rugged, at 4 P.M. saw a school of sperm Whales going quick to windward, it being near night did not lower, Middle and latter part, much the same, headed S.E. by S. employed in Ship duty, so ends. Lat 29.05 Long 108.05

Friday January the 29th

Commenced with a strong wind and rugged middle part the same, latter part more moderate and fine weather, headed to the S. saw nothing, employed in Ship duty, so ends Lat 29.50, Long by Obs 107.04
Long by Obs 107.17

Saturday January the 30th

Commenced with a moderate breeze at S.E. and fine weather, Middle and latter part a strong breeze at S.E. standing on different tacks, employed in Ship duty, so ends
Lat 30.06 Long 106.51 E

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Sunday January the 31st

Commenced with a strong breeze at S.E. and overcast weather, headed to the S.W. Middle part the same, at daylight saw a Ship standing to the S.W. with all sail set. Latter part fine weather, headed E by S. so ends. Lat 30.26, Long by Obs 106.40 E

Monday February the 1st 1841

Commenced with a moderate breeze at S.E. and fine weather, Middle and latter part strong winds and rugged weather, headed E by S. at 3 P.M. saw a Ship standing to the S.W. so ends
Lat 30.20, Long 107.50 E

Tuesday February the 2nd

Commenced with a strong breeze at S.E. and rugged, Middle and latter part the same, headed E by S. saw nothing employed in Ship duty, so ends. Lat 29.53 Long by Obs 108.46 E

Wednesday February the 3rd

Commenced with strong winds at S.E. and rugged, Middle and latter part the same, headed E by S. saw nothing employed in Ship duty, so ends. Lat 29.18, Long by Obs 109.54 E

Thursday February the 4th

Commenced with a fresh breeze at S.E. and S.E. Middle part lay by, latter part a moderate breeze and fine weather, at 9 P.M. spoke with the Ship Maria Theresia Turner her Redpan 900 bbls. or W. employed in Ship duty, so ends
Lat 28.45

Friday February the 5th

All this 24 hours a fresh breeze at S.E. and fine weather, standing on different tacks in company with the Maria Theresia employed in Ship duty, so ends. Lat 28.16
Long 110.28
