

Ship Montpelier on the West Coast of New Holland 1841

Thursday February the 18th

Commences with a fresh breeze at S E, and smoky weather, working to the N. Middle part dry by, but part light winds and fine weather, saw nothing employ in ships duty, so ends. Lat 22.20 Long 111.20 E

Friday February the 19th

Commences with fine weather and light winds at S E, working to the N. one sail in sight, Middle and latter part much the same, saw nothing, so ends

Lat 22.43 Long 111.00 E

Saturday February the 20th

Commences with a brisk breeze at S E and smoky weather, Middle and latter part light winds and pleasant weather at 11 A.M. saw a ~~small~~ school of sperm whales, headed to the W. so ends. Lat 22.29 Long 110.35

Sunday February the 21st

Commences with light winds and pleasant weather, headed to the W. saw one fine bark, Middle and latter part much the same, so ends. Lat 21.52, Long 109.56

Monday February the 22nd

Commences with pleasant breezes and fine weather headed to the S, at 4 P.M. saw Breaches, near midday a black 1 hour saw nothing, none, Middle and latter part much the same, headed S W by S. saw nothing, so ends

Lat 21.45, Long 109.40 E

Tuesday February the 23rd

Commences with a brisk breeze at W N W headed to the S, Middle and latter part much the same, saw nothing, employ in ships duty, so ends, Lat 22.42,

Long 110.10 E

Wednesday February the 24th

Commences with a fresh breeze at South, headed to the W, Middle part a strong breeze at 11 am. saw nothing with a shower of rain, latter part a moderate breeze at 11 am fine weather, steered South saw nothing, so ends. Lat 23.37. N. 146

Thursday February the 25th

Commences with light air at S E E, and pleasant weather headed South, Middle part the same. latter part a brisk breeze at 1 day E headed S W by W, saw nothing employ in ships duty, so ends. Lat 24.13 Long 109.04

Friday February the 26th

Commences with a fresh breeze S by E and smoky weather, Middle and latter part much the same headed S W, saw nothing employ in ships duty, so ends. Lat 24.37

Long 108.27

Saturday February the 27th

Commences with a fresh breeze at S E and smoky, Middle and latter part much the same, headed S W saw nothing, so ends. Lat 25.22 Long by Obs 107.13

Long by Chron 107.18

Sunday February the 28th

Commences with strong winds and rugged at 4 P.M. spoke Ship Maria Cor Roberts Town, 6 Miles out nothing, latter part more moderate, standing on different tacks saw nothing, thus ends. Lat 25.32, Long by Obs 107.27 E

Monday March the 1st 1841

Commences with a fresh breeze at S E and smoky weather, Middle saw nothing, latter part much the same standing on different tacks, saw nothing, thus ends

Lat 25.41 Long by Obs 108.20, Long by Chron 108.15
