Tuesday March the 16th

Commences with a fresh breeze at S & am pleasant
weather headed to the E, Middle part the same, further part strong
winds headed S.W. saw nothing employed in ships duty, so ends

Wednesday March the 17th

Commences with strong winds and rugged, Middle
and further part much the same by head to the W. saw
nothing, thus ends, Lat 2448 Long 10942 &

Thursday March the 18th

Commences with a gale at S & E and overcast

part headed to the E, so ends, Lat 2511 16 Obs

Friday March the 19th

Commences with a gale at S & in a heavy sea
headed to the E at sunset saw ships to the S at midnight
saw ships to the E ends with a strong gale and thick weather.

heavy sea, at 1 P.M. took in the Bow Boat, Middle and further part
more moderate, at daylight set two reef topsails headed S &

a fresh breeze at S & am squally weather, heading to the S
saw nothing employed in ships duty, so ends, Lat 2433 Long 10936
