

Ship Montpelier on the West Coast of New Holland 1841

Friday March the 26th

Commences with strong winds and ruggs; Middle and latter part much the same, standing on different tack, one sail in sight, so ends, Lat 24.09. N. Obs

Saturday March the 27th

Commences with a fresh breeze at S & an thick overcast weather at 3 P.M. spoke the Crossack Telling of Rochester & months out nothing, Middle and latter part more moderate, standing on different tacks in box with the Crossack, saw nothing so ends, Lat 24.06 N. Obs

Sunday March the 28th

Commences with light winds at S & an thick overcast weather, Middle part the same, latter part light airs and pleasant weather, standing on different tack, saw nothing, Lat 23.58, Long 109.42

Monday March the 29th

Commences with light winds at S & an pleasant weather, Middle and latter part much the same, standing on different tack, saw nothing, employed repairing a Main Top sail thus ends, Lat 24.11

Tuesday March the 30th

Commences with light winds at S & an pleasant weather, Middle and latter part fresh breezes, standing on different tacks, saw nothing, employed repairing the main sail so ends, Lat 23.57, Long by Chron 110.8

Wednesday March the 31st

Commences with a brisk breeze at S & an pleasant weather, Middle part the same, latter part strong winds and ruggs, at 2 P.M. saw a Whale spout several times ran up with the ground and lay a back 1 hour, saw nothing one sail in sight so ends, Lat 23.55, N. Obs

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Thursday April the 1st

Commences with a strong breeze at S & an ruggs, Middle and latter part the same, at 2 P.M. part a Bangor ship hauling, thus ends, Lat 23.50 Long 111.31 E

Friday April the 2nd

Commences with strong winds at S & an ruggs, Middle and latter part much the same, standing on different tacks, one sail in sight, employed in Ships duty, sounds Lat 24.16 Long 109.38

Saturday April the 3rd

Commences with strong winds at S & an ruggs, standing to the S, Middle part the same, latter part moderate and fine pleasant weather, steered to the N. saw nothing, employed in Ships duty, thus ends, Lat 23.39, Long 110.06 E

Sunday April the 4th

Commences with light airs and fine pleasant weather, standing to the S, Middle part the same, latter part calm, saw nothing, so ends, Lat 23.38, N. Obs

Monday April the 5th

Commences with light airs and calms, and fine pleasant weather, Middle part we were visited with sharp lightning and heavy thunder with rain, latter part a strong breeze at S, an thick overcast weather, headed to the S saw nothing, employed in Ships duty, thus ends, N. Obs

Tuesday April the 6th

Commences with a strong breeze at S, an thick overcast weather, Middle and latter part much the same, headed to the N, saw nothing, employed in Ships duty, thus ends, Lat 23.28 Long 109.16 E
