

Ship Montpelier on the West Coast of New Holland 1841

Sunday April the 18th

Commences with light airs and calms, the Boats in case of Whales, at 3 o'clock but could not strike, gave up the chase and came on deck. Middle and Lutter part much the same saw nothing, so ends. Lat 22.55. Long by Chron 109.11

Monday April the 19th

Commences with light airs and calms at 1 P.M. saw Breccies could not tell what they were, Middle and Lutter part much the same, one sail in sight, employed in Ships duty, thus ends. Lat 23.18, No Obs

Tuesday April the 20th

Commences with light airs and calms Middle part the same, Lutter a fresh breeze at 8th and thick overcast weather, at 8 M spoke with Ship Leonid as Steamer Fairhaven 700 bbls S.C. so ends. Lat 23.24

Wednesday April the 21st

Commences with strong winds at 8th and rugg. 2. 4 Ships in sight, Middle and Lutter part much the same, at 9 A.M. spoke the Ship Mercator Dilena New Bedford 350 bbls S.C. so ends. Lat 23.22

Thursday April the 22nd

Commences with strong winds at 8th and rugg. at 3 P.M. spoke with 2 Ships, the Adeline Gray New Bedford 500 bbls 250 Sperm the Heanah, Demand Fairhaven 900 bbls 40 S.C. Middle and Lutter part strong winds at 8th, standing on different tacks, saw nothing employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 22.55. Long Long 110.00

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Friday April the 23rd

Commences with strong winds at 8th and rugg. at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship South Boston Command Fairhaven 8100 bbls 4.50 Sperm, Middle and Lutter part light winds and fine pleasant weather, at 10 A.M. spoke with the Federal, several Ships in sight, so ends. Lat 22.45. 109.40

Saturday April the 24th

Commences with light airs and calms, in Co. with the Ship Adeline and South Boston, Middle part the same, Lutter part a fine breeze at 8th, standing on different tacks, employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 22.52

Sunday April the 25th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather, standing to the E saw one fine Back Middle part the same, Lutter part thick overcast weather headed to the W saw nothing so ends. Lat 22.06 Long 110.29

Monday April the 26th

Commences with light winds at 8th and overcast weather headed to the W. Middle and Lutter part much the same, saw several fine Backs, one sail in sight, employed in Ships duty, thus ends. Lat 23.33 Long 110.05

Tuesday April the 27th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather, at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Mercia, Mosher Fairhaven 2200 bbls 600 Sperm Middle part light airs and calms, Lutter part a fine breeze at W, and pleasant weather headed to the E two Ships in sight, thus ends. Lat 23.50
