

Ship Montpelier on the West Coast of New Holland 1841

Saturday May the 8<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a strong breeze at S E and  
thick overcast weather marking to the N W. At 3 P.M. finished stowing  
down 7 bbls at 4 spoke the Cassack, Middle and Lutter part  
strong winds and squage, 3 Ships in sight, so ends Lat 23.55

Sunday May the 9<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong winds at S E and squage  
At 2 P.M. spoke the bark Orono & Marthee Smally Miv Redford  
900 bbls, 360 Spinn, Middle and Lutter part much the same  
standing in different tacks, 3 Ships in sight, so ends Lat 24.36

Monday May the 10<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong winds at S E and  
squage, Middle and Lutter part much the same, standing  
in different tacks, saw several firm backs, 5 Ships in sight  
employed in Ships duty, so ends, Lat 24.17 Long 110.18. E

Tuesday May the 11<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a fresh breeze at S E and  
overcast weather, marking to the N W, Middle and Lutter the  
same, saw several firm backs, so ends, Lat 23.48

Wednesday May the 12<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a fresh breeze at  
S E and overcast weather, headed E S E, Middle the same  
Lutter part headed to the S W, saw several firm backs, 3 Ships  
in sight, so ends, No Obs

Thursday May the 13<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong winds at S E, At 1  
P.M. spoke the Vincas 1000 bbls Spinn, At 3 P.M. spoke the Main  
Fairhouse 1100 bbls 150 Spinn, At 4 P.M. the dealines Middle and  
Lutter part strong winds and thick rainy weather, so ends, No Obs

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Friday May the 14<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong winds at S and thick squally  
weather, At 4<sup>th</sup> part 4 P.M. saw a Leany Breech it proved to be a firm  
back, Middle part much the same Lutter part strong winds and clear  
weather, standing in different tacks, saw 2 firm backs, employed  
in Ships duty, so ends, Lat 24.30, Long by Obs 110.08, Long by Chron  
109.34

Saturday May the 15<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong winds at S E and fine  
weather, Middle and Lutter part much the same, standing in to the  
N E, saw many firm backs, employed in Ships duty, so ends,  
Lat 23.47, Long 110.30 E

Sunday May the 16<sup>th</sup>

Commences with strong winds at S E and clear  
weather, headed E S E, Middle part the same, Lutter part headed  
to the S, one sail in sight, saw several firm backs, so ends  
Lat 23.54 Long 109.56

Monday May the 17<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a fresh breeze at S E and fine  
pleasant weather, At 2 P.M. spoke the Ship Resolution of London  
400 bbls Spinn, Middle and Lutter part light winds and fine weather  
stead W in co. with the Resolution, saw nothing, so ends, Lat 23.16

Tuesday May the 18<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light winds and fine weather  
headed W S W, in co with the Resolution, Middle and Lutter part  
much the same, saw nothing, employed in Ships duty, so ends  
Lat 23.57

Wednesday May the 19<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant  
weather, Middle and Lutter part the same, 4 sail in sight, saw  
one firm back, so ends, Lat 24.22
