

Ship Montpelier on the West Coast of New Holland 1841

Monday May the 31st

Commences with a fine breeze and pleasant weather. At sunset spoke the Bangwa Bantain; Middle and Lutter part much the same, saw several fine Backs and sail in sight, so ends. Lat 22 27.

Tuesday June the 1st 1841

Commences with light winds at S E and fine pleasant weather; headed S E W. Middle and Lutter part the same, saw several fine Backs, so ends. Lat 22 40. Long 107 10

Wednesday June the 2nd

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather, steering in the N E. Middle part much the same Lutter part strong winds at S E W. and rugged, steered W N W. saw several fine Backs, so ends. Lat 22 40. Long 107 08 E

Thursday June the 3rd

Commences with strong winds at S, and rugged, steering W N W, at 3 P M owned a squall the low Boat saw the ship to, and downed a Boat and took her a long ride and took her up, and repaired damage; Middle part much the same, Lutter part more moderate with a large swell steered W, saw two fine Backs, so ends. Lat 22 31. Long 106 16

Friday June the 4th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather with a large swell, steered N W. Middle and Lutter part much the same, saw nothing, employed 9 landing men sailors, so ends, Lat 22 04. Long 105 21 E

Saturday June the 5th Commences with light winds, steering W N W employed fitting and setting steering sails, ends with light winds and fine pleasant weather, steering W by S, all sail set, Lat 21 58 N. Obs

Ship Montpelier in the Indian Ocean 1841.

Sunday June the 6th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather, steering W by N, saw one fine Back and a large leech. Middle and Lutter part winds variable from N E to S E W. headed W and W S W, saw nothing, so ends. Lat 22 10. Long 101 53 E.

Monday June the 7th

Commences with a fresh breeze at N E W. and equally weather; Middle and Lutter part a fresh at W, headed N N W, saw several fine Backs, employed 9 in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 21 47. Long 100 43

Tuesday June the 8th

Commences with a moderate breeze at W, Middle part light winds and variable with squalls of rain, Lutter part a light breeze at S E. steered W by N, saw several fine Backs, employed in Ships duty, thus ends. Lat 21 16. Long 99 29 E

Wednesday June the 9th

Commences with light winds and pleasant weather, Middle and Lutter part much the same, steering W by N. All sail set, employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 20 50. Long 97 30

Thursday June the 10th

Commences with fresh winds and pleasant weather, Middle part much the same, Lutter part strong winds and overcast weather, steered W by N, all sail set, employed in Ships duty, thus ends. N. Obs. Lat by a count 20 30. Long by Chron 95 23 E

Friday June the 11th

Commences with fresh winds and pleasant weather Middle and Lutter part light winds and squalls, steered W by N, saw several fine Backs, employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 20 21 Long by Chron 93 31. Long by Chron 93 46 E.
