

Ship Montpelier in the Indian Ocean, 1841

Thursday June the 24th

Commenced with fine trade and pleasant weather
all sail set steering W. At sunset took in sail and heaved ^{up} by the main
header to the N. At day light saw the land the Gal of St Francois
bearing per compass W distant 4 leagues, latter point light was
calms, saw Black fish, employed repairing the fore topsail, so ends

Friday June the 25th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant ^{part}
weather steering in for the Linn. At 5 P.M. sent a Boat in shore at 1/2 6
the Boat returned stating that there was plenty of wood and water
Middle and latter part light winds and variable back and we tack
to keep close to the Linn. At 9 A.M. sent a raft of 6 pipes on shore
for water, so ends.

Saturday June the 26th Commences with light winds and fine
pleasant weather laying off and on the Ill of Bodénique, At 8 P.M.
took the water on board, wore ship and steamed S. E. & putter went
fresh towards and pleasant weather saw nothing so early, Sat 19.40

Sunday June the 27th

Commenced with brisk trade and pleasant weather, at sunset shortened sail, at daylight made sail standing on different tacks, one sail in sight, saw the Lark, 30 miles
 Dec 19. 25

Monday June the 28th

Commences with stormy troids and pleasant
weather, steering W & W, at 3 PM put a Brig steering N E
showing English colors. Middle and further part stormy.
troids and equally weather, curing all powder ~~at~~ sail, unemploye
in Ships duty, so ends. Sat 20.24 Lorry 6 W & E

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Tuesday June the 29.th

commenced with light winds, and variable
middle part the same with a plenty of rain, latter part strong
winds and squally, steered W by S, carrying all fore and aft sail
saw nothing employed in ships during so much, Lat 20 58, No Obs

Wednesday June the 30th

Commenced with stormy trails and equally weather with a plenty of rain. Middle part much the same. Latter part light winds at N.W. & W.S.W. saw nothing employed in ships duty, so ends. Lat 21.38. Long 57.32 E

Thursday July the 1st 18.41

Commenced with light winds at W. & Middle
and latter part strong winds at S.W. and pleasant weather
breeze W. N. W. At daylight saw the Isl of Barbados bearing
per compass W. S. W. Dist 40. Mils, saw several fine Bucks, &c. ends
Lat 11, 36

Friday July the 2nd

Commences with strong winds at S.W., standing
on different tacks to weather the Island; At 6 P.M. were Ship and
headed W. Middle and latter part a fresh breeze at S. and pleasant
weather; steered W S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W. saw several birds but not tell
what they were; employed in Ships duty, as usual. Lat. 20° 54'
Long. 55° 10' E.

Secretary Feb 10th 3rd

Commenced with a brisk breeze at 8 am fine weather
headed W by S. Middle and latter part much the same, sun. Nothing
employ in ship's duty, so ends. Lat 22.30 Long 83.04 E

Sunday Feb. the 4th commenced with light winds, at 1 am squally
breeze W by S. Middle noon latter part much the same, saw nothing
thus ends. Lat 22.54. Long 51.18. E
