Wednesday Sept the 29th

All these 24 hours moderate trades and fine weather, steered N.W. employed in Ships duty, so ends.
Lat 26.08. Long by Chron 57.30 W

Thursday Sept the 30th

All these 24 hours moderate winds at S.E. and fine pleasant weather, steered N.W. 1/2 W. employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 27.10 Long by Chron 59.12 W

Friday October the 1st

All these 24 hours brisk winds at S. and equally weather with rain, steered N.W. 1/2 W. employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 28.23. Long by Chron 60.53 W

Saturday October the 2nd

All these 24 hours fresh winds at S. and S.W. and equally, steered N.W. 1/2 W. saw one Sail standing to the Eastward, employed in Ships duty, so ends.
Lat 29.40 Long by Chron 62.53 W

Sunday October the 3rd

All these 24 hours strong winds at S.W. and equally steered N.W. by W. saw a Brig steering N.E. so ends. Lat 30.57. Long by Chron 64.56 W

Monday October the 4th

first and middle part strong gales at S.W. and overcast weather, steered N.W. by W. Latter part light winds at W.S.W. headed N. employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 32.00 Long by Chron 66.00 W

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Tuesday October the 5th

Commenced with strong winds at W.N.W. and overcast weather, Middle and Latter part fresh gales at W.N.W. and N.W. headed to the N. Ship under two reef topsails at 1/2 6, part a Brig steering S.E. so ends. Lat 33.36. Long by Chron 65.30 W

Wednesday October the 6th

Commenced with fresh gales at W.N.W. and N.W. and equally headed to the N. under two reef topsails. Middle and Latter part much the same, employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 34.25. Long by Chron 65.42, Long by Obs 65.14

Thursday October the 7th

All these 24 hours fresh gales at W.N.W. and N.W. and equally, headed to the N. employed in Ships duty so ends. Lat 35.12 Long by Chron 65.05. Long by Obs 64.35 W

Friday October the 8th

All these 24 hours light winds at N. and N.W. headed to the W. at sunset part a Brig steering E.N.E. at daylight saw a sail standing to the W. employed in Ships duty, so ends. Lat 34.18 Long by Chron 65.45 Long by Obs 65.50 W

Saturday October the 9th

Commenced with light ^{air} calm. Middle and Latter part fresh gales at S.W. and W.S.W. and thick overcast weather headed N.W. carrying all prudent sail, thus ends.
Lat 35.22 Long by Chron 66.06 Long by Obs 66.31 W

Sunday October the 10th Commenced with fresh gales at W.S.W. and W. and thick weather, at 2 P.M. part a Schooner standing to the S. Middle and Latter part light winds at N.W. and N. headed N.W. and W.S.W. at daylight saw two sail standing to the W. so ends. Lat 35.27 Long by Chron 68.05 W
