

Montpelier Taber, Master

Sunday January the 22nd 1842

at 8 A.M. took the anchor and
steamed out to sea, At 11 A.M. the Pilot left us, At noon part the
Ship Draper standing in to the Bay, thus ends

Monday January the 23rd

Commences with fine pleasant weather
the wind N.W. Steaming S.E. All hands employed Steaming
anchors and chains and cleaning the decks. Middle and Latter
parts fine clear weather with fresh breeze at N.W. Steaming
S.E. day, thus ends. Lat by Obs 40.03.

Tuesday January the 24th

Commences with a fresh breeze at N
Middle and Latter part light winds and variables, saw
a sail standing to the S.W. thus ends. Lat by Obs 38.45

Wednesday January the 25th

Commences with a fresh at S.W. and thick
squally weather Middle part a strong gale at S.W.
with a plenty of rain day day. Latter part more moderate
the wind at W carrying all pendant sail, steering S.E.
employed in Ships duty, so ends No Obs

Thursday January the 26th

Commences with light variable winds
and thick rainy weather, Middle and Latter part a
strong gale at S.W. and W with heavy squalls and a heavy
sea day day under a close reef Main Topsail headed to the S.
so ends. No Obs.

Friday January the 27th

Commences with a strong gale at N.W. Middle part much
the same, Latter part more moderate at day light
made all pendant sail, steamed S.E. employed in Ships duty
No Obs
