headed to the E. Middle part much the same at 10 past 10 Wane
Ship headed S.E. Latter part light winds and squally the same
at E. headed S.E. employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Saturday February the 12th

Commences with light winds at E. and squally, headed S.E.

Sunday February the 13th

Commences with a fresh breeze at E.N.E. and fine pleasant
weather, at 10 past 4 saw several breeches. Dir 6 miles Middle
part light winds and squally, headed to the S.E. Latter part light
winds at E.N.E. at 7 A.M. tracked Ship headed N.E. thus ends

Monday February the 14th

Commences with light airs and calms, and fine pleasant
weather Middle and Latter part the same. All hands employed
fishing, mignon, thus ends

Tuesday February the 15th

Commences with a calm, at 10 P.M. light airs at E. Wane Ship
headed S.E. Latter part a fine breeze at E. and clear
weather, saw 3 sail standing to the N. employed in Ship's
duty thus ends

Wednesday February the 16th

Commences with a fine breeze at E. and clear weather, Middle
and Latter part fresh S.E. towards winds, clear S.E. by E. At 10 past
7 saw Black Fish, lowered and struck one and down, at 11 A.M. past
the Ship a deload of London, headed to the N. Two more sail in
sight at the same time employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Thursday February the 17th

Commences with fresh winds and fine pleasant weather, at 2 P.M.
exchanged signals with a English Ship headed to the N.
Middle and Latter part strong winds and squally, carrying
all foreward sail, steering S.E. employed in Ship's duty, so ends

Lat by Obs 22.17 Long by Obs 36.50 W

Friday February the 18th

Commences with strong winds and squally weather, at 2 P.M.
past a Brig standing to the N. Middle and Latter part the
same, stood S.E. employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Lat by Obs 21.00 Long by Obs 35.58

Saturday February the 19th

Commences with strong winds and squally weather, Middle and
Latter part much the same, steering S.E. employed in Ship's
duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 19.07 Long by Obs 34.46

Sunday February the 20th

Commences with fresh winds and fine pleasant weather
Middle and Latter part a breeze towards and squally weather
steering S.E. one sail in sight, thus ends
