

Ship Montpelier in the Atlantic Ocean 1842

Thursday March the 10th

All these 24 hours light moderate winds and fine pleasant weather steered S S W. employed Blacking chains and the Ship in work thus ends

Lat by Obs 15.46 Long by Obs 35.53 W

Friday March the 11th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather Middle and Latter part the same steered S S W. employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 16.46 Long by Obs 36.16

Saturday March the 12th

Commences with light winds and fine pleasant weather Middle and Latter part the same steered S S W. saw nothing employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 18.09 Long by account 36.50 W

Sunday March the 13th

First and Middle parts bright airs and calms steered S by W. Latter part a moderate breeze at N and fine pleasant weather standing on different tacks looking sharp for Green Whales, one sail in sight thus ends

Lat by Obs 19.08 Long by account 36.30 W

Monday March the 14th

All these 24 hours brisk breeze at N by E standing on different tacks a sail in sight employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 18.51 Long by Obs 36.43 W

Tuesday March the 15th

Commences with a brisk breeze at N and fine pleasant weather heading W N W. Middle part squally with sharp lightning headed to the E. Latter part steered S S W. employed in repairing the Mizen Top sail thus ends

Wednesday March the 16th

All these 24 hours fresh breeze at N. Middle part squally with sharp lightning and rain Latter part more pleasant steered S S W. employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Ship Montpelier on the Coast of Brazil 1842

Thursday March the 17th

Commences with light moderate winds at N and fine weather Middle and Latter part strong winds at S W and squally weather standing on different tacks saw nothing employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 22.22 Long by Obs 38.27 Long by Obs 37.53

Friday March the 18th

Commences with strong winds at S W. Middle and Latter part light winds and fine weather standing on different tacks saw nothing employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 21.09 Long by account 38.40 W

Saturday March the 19th

Commences with light winds at S W and over cast weather headed to the S. Middle part bright airs and calms at daylight saw 2 sail one Brig steering N N E. the other sail Bremenely was a Whaler one saw quite quantities of Lark rising from her Latter part a moderate breeze at W S W and over cast weather heading S. employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Sunday March the 20th

All these 24 hours light moderate winds at S and fine pleasant weather standing on different tacks one sail in sight thus ends

Lat by Obs 22.40 Long by Obs 40.11 W Long by Obs 39.18

Monday March the 21st

Commences with light winds at S and fine weather heading E S E. Middle and Latter part a fine breeze at S E by S at sunset tacked to Ship's head S W by S. employed in Ship's duty thus ends

Lat by Obs 23.33 Long by Obs 41.18 Long by Obs 40.08 W

Tuesday March the 22nd

All these 24 hours light winds and fine pleasant weather steering W. At daylight saw the Land Bearing Per compass W N W Distance 15. Mils First part employed in Ship's duty Latter part All hands employed in Bending chains and brading out for Watter Cakes. saw several sail in sight thus ends
