

Ship Montpelier In Delagoa Bay 1842

Saturday June the 25th

All these 24 hours, fine pleasant weather At 3 P.M. struck a Whale 30 Mils from the Ships, and killd the Boats employed towing the Whale up to the Ships saw 2 more Whales chase without success, so it ends

Sunday June the 26th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather At 10 P.M. took the Whale a long ride the Snel, Latter part 2 Boats from each Ship in search for Whales, the rest employed in cutting the Whale thus ends



Monday June the 27th

All these 24 hours fine weather At 3 P.M. struck a Whale and killd 35 Mils from the Ships, got our Stanburn Boat stores At 3 A.M. got the Gonge under way, to go down the Bay and cut in the Whale employed repairing the Boat, two men on Board the Snel, and two Boats horses down the Bay & Co, thus ends

Tuesday June the 28th

All these 24 hours fine weather At 3 P.M. finish cutting the Whale got the Ship under way, at sunset came to anchor At 5 P.M. saw 21 Whales in the Bay from the Ships. Lamen the Boats and chased without success

Wednesday June the 29th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather two Boats from each Ship in search of Whales saw Nothing, employed this day standing down Oil & Co, thus ends

Thursday June the 30th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather two Boats from each Ship in search of Whales saw two Whales, chase with out success, saw Barque Ship down the Bay suppose to be the Geary & Mather, so ends

Friday July the 1st 1842

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather two Boats from each Ship in search of Whales saw Nothing, thus ends the day

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Saturday July the 2nd

All these 24 hours, strong winds at N, and thick over cast weather, two Boats from each Ship in search of Whales saw one, chase with out success, so ends

Sunday July the 3rd

Commences with fine weather Middle and Latter part strong winds at S, and rugged to rugged to go in search for Whales thus ends

Monday July the 4th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the Boats in search of Whales as usual, got one Boat store by the scarp in trying to Lamen, saw Nothing, the Stanburn Boat went up to Dear Island and got two Deer, thus ends

Tuesday July the 5th

Commences with fine weather, Middle and Latter part strong winds at S and rugged to rugged to go in search of Whales, thus ends

Wednesday July the 6th

Commences with fine pleasant weather, Middle and Latter part strong winds at S First part Boats in search of Whales Latter part to rugged

Thursday July the 7th

Commence with strong winds at S, Latter part fine pleasant weather the Boats in search of Whales as usual saw Nothing, employed on board the Ship painting Top Gallant masts & top Gallant yards & Blacked one side of the Ships Bennis & Co, thus ends

Friday July the 8th

All this 24 hours fine pleasant weather the Boats in search of Whales as usual, saw Nothing, employed in Ships duty thus ends

Saturday July the 9th

All these 24 hours, fine pleasant weather, saw Nothing, employed this day repairing the Oil and Barre thus ends
