

Ship Montpelier in St Augustine Bay 1842

Thursday September 1st

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather, this day arrived the Barque Jane, Manchester Somerset, 200 bbls Sperms & 200 bbls. in W. employe in Watering, thus ends.

Friday September 2^d

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather employe in Ships duty, thus ends.

Saturday 3^d

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather employe in Ships duty, thus ends.

Sunday Sept 4th

All these 24 hours fine weather, at day light could all hands to get under way, found one Man missing, Captain Taber gave one of the Natives 6 pathams of Cotton Cloth to bring him on board; the Native went on shore, and returned with the Man haul up the Anchor and made sail it proved to be calm, let go Anchor and pink the sails, thus ends.

Monday Sept 5th

All these 24 hours fine weather, at daylight got under way with a fine breeze at E and stea out to sea, all hands employe stowing Anchors and Chances, and Ships duty, &c. thus ends.

Tuesday Sept 6th

All these 24 hours strong breezes and clear weather, First and Middle parts the wind at E. headed W & W. Latter the wind at E & E. steamed S & W. carrying all foremast sail, employe in fitting Boats and Ships duty, thus ends.

Wednesday Sept 7th

Commences with a brisk breeze at E & E. headed S. Middle part much the same, Latter part light winds and variable, heading to the S. saw one Humpback; employe in Ships duty, thus ends.

Ship Montpelier in the Indian Ocean 1842

Thursday Sept 8th

Commences with fine weather and light variable winds, Middle part the same, Latter part a fine breeze at S. steamed E. saw Nothing, employe in Painting Boats, thus ends.

Lat by Ob. 25.24. Long by Chron 23.55 E.

Friday Sept 9th

Commences with light winds at S and fine weather steering E, Middle and Latter part strong breezes at E & E. headed S. saw Nothing, employe in Sail Making, & Ships duty, thus ends.

Lat by Ob. 25.38 S. Long by Chron 24.33 E.

Saturday Sept 10th

All these 24 hours strong gales at S & E. E. day by under short sail, heading to the S. saw Nothing, employe in Sail Making & Ships duty, thus ends.

Lat by Ob. 26.27 S. Long by Chron 24.20 E.

Sunday Sept 11th

Commences more moderate, the wind at E, Ship heading S & E. At Midnight wave Ship headed N by E. Latter part light airs and calms, saw Nothing, thus ends.

Monday Sept 12th

Commences with light airs at W. and fine pleasant weather, Middle and Latter part light variable winds Ship working to the Eastward under all sail saw Nothing, employe in sail making thus ends.

Lat by Ob. 26.01 Long by Chron 24.01 E.

Tuesday Sept 13th

Commences with light winds at E & E. and fine pleasant weather headed N.E. at 1 P.M. saw a Barque Ship standing to the S. Middle part strong breezes at E & E. headed to the S. Latter part light variable winds, Ship working to the Eastward, employe in repairing the Main Tapsail, thus ends.
