Saturday January 21st

Commences with strong winds at N and thick weather Middle and latter part more moderate ~~with~~ with thick over cast weather steered per Compass S & S. E. running all prudent sail, saw Nothing Employed repairing the Fore Topsail: thus ends

Sunday January 22nd

Commences with moderate winds at W and over cast weather Middle part much the same; Latter part a brisk breeze at N W. and thick weather; steered per Compass S & by S & by S all sail set, saw Nothing, thus ends

Lat by Ob 44.04. Long by Chron 120.08. E

Monday January 23rd

All there 24 hours brisk winds at N. and over cast weather, steered per Compass S & S. saw Nothing but Forebacks employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Lat by Ob 44.23. S. No Ob

Tuesday January 24th

Commences with a brisk breeze at N & a thick weather; Middle and latter part strong winds at N E. and squally weather with rain, steered per Compass S & S all prudent sail set, saw Nothing but Forebacks, employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Lat by Ob 45.04. S Long by Chron 127.56. E

Wednesday January 25th

All there 24 hours strong winds at N. and squally weather with hail and rain; steered S & S. at 8 A.M. saw one or two Whales shortened sail and kept by the wind; heading S. to run up to lower end, employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Lat by Ob 45.23. S Long by Chron 130.17. E

Thursday January 26th

Commences with strong winds at W. and squally weather heading to the N. W. at 11 A.M. shortened sail more Ship heading S. Middle and latter parts thick rainy weather the rain from W to N W. at 8 A.M. steered S by S all prudent sail set, no end No Ob

Ship Montpelier On The South Coast Of New Holland 1823

Friday January 27th

Commences with strong winds at N W. and thick rainy weather Middle and latter part strong winds at W and pleasant weather, steered S by S all prudent sail set, at 10 A.M. saw one or two Whales to run up to lower employed in Ship's duty, no end Lat by Ob 45.35. S Long by Chron 135.03. E



Saturday January 28th

Commences with strong winds at W N W. and over cast Middle part the same, steering S by S all prudent sail set, at day light saw one or two Whales, lowered the boats and struck 3 Whales got one Boat stores and lost one Line and 4 Boats and killed one Whale at 11 A.M. took the Whales long ridges and commenced cutting, ends with strong winds and squally weather Lat by Ob 45.31. S No Ob

Sunday January 29th

All there 24 hours strong winds at W. and squally at 11 P.M. finished cutting; at sunset commenced boiling the Ship under short sail heading to the N. E. saw Nothing employed in Boiling, thus ends

No Ob

Monday January 30th

All there 24 hours strong winds and raining from W to S Fore and Middle parts Ship heading to the N. under short sail, employed in Boiling, at 4 P.M. finished Boiling, and made sail and steered S. ends more moderate and over cast, saw Nothing

Lat by Ob 46.16. S Long by Chron 140.08. E

Tuesday January 31st

Commences with a brisk breeze at S and over cast, steering S. all sail set, one Ship in sight steering S. Middle part light winds at N. at day light saw one or two Whales, commenced but saw Nothing more of the Whales ends with bright airs and calms 2 Ships in sight, employed in stowing down

Lat by Ob 46.04. S Long by Chron 144.35. E
