

Ship Montpelier to Mouree May 1843

Tuesday May 23rd

All there 24 hours fine pleasant weather this day Discharged Stephen Beatch the Panth Mate a Native of the Island at the same time Discharged Robert B Johnson a seaman in consequence of not being able to perform the voyage at 11 AM Shipped 3 Natives and sent on Board at the same time took Thomas Galago and Henry Penamick and up the Port two Men that Deported from the Ship so ends

Wednesday May 24th

Commences with fine weather the two Men that were taken out of the Port. Amone that would not do any more duty on Board the Ship. Further more Thomas Galago said that he was Ruptured and not able to do duty. Capt. Eaker took him on shore and the Doctor pronounced him able to do duty. took him on Board the Ship the Man Refused duty at 3 P.M put him in Amone at daylight got under way with light air and calms put two Boats a head to sea at 11 AM had a light breeze from S & S by steered West caught the Boats a bang side and hoisted them up, thus ends

Thursday May 25th

All there 24 hours fine pleasant weather Bunt and Middle part light air and calms steering different courses to clear the Islands. Latter part a brisk breeze at N & S steered per compass N by W two Ships in sight steering to the N W 3 Islands in sight, thus ends

Friday May 26th

Commences with a brisk breeze at N & S and fine weather Middle and Latter part a brisk breeze at East steered per compass N all sail set saw Nothing Employed in Ships duty, thus ends

Lat by Obs 23.46. N Long by Obs 157.24 W

Ship Montpelier in the Pacific Ocean 1843

Saturday May 27th

Commences with a brisk breeze at S & S Middle and Latter part fresh breezes at S & S and fine weather steered per compass N by W all sail set saw Nothing Employed in Ships duty, thus ends

Lat by Obs 26.24 N Long by Obs 157.27 W

Sunday May 28th

Commences with a fresh breeze at South and fine pleasant weather Middle and Latter part much the same steered per compass N by W all sail set saw Nothing, thus ends

Lat by Obs 28.26 N Long by Obs 157.36 W

Monday May 29th

Commences with light winds at S & S and fine pleasant weather Latter part light variable winds and thick rainy weather steered per compass N by W all sail set saw Nothing Employed in Ships duty, thus ends

Lat by Obs 29.48 N 158.00 W

Tuesday May 30th

Commences with light winds at S & S and thick weather Middle and Latter part variable winds and thick rainy weather steered per compass N by W all sail set saw Nothing Employed in Ships duty, thus ends

No Obs Lat by a count 31.35 N

Wednesday May 31st

All there 24 hours fresh breezes from S and thick rainy weather steered per compass N by W all sail set saw Nothing Employed in Ships duty, thus ends

No Obs Lat by a count 33.50 N

Thursday June 1st 1843

Commences with a fresh breeze at S and thick rainy weather with heavy squalls Middle part more moderate Latter part fine weather steered per compass N by W all sail set saw Nothing so ends Lat 36.55 N Long 156.23 W
