Sunday June 11th

Commences with moderate winds at 6 and thick foggy weather. Middle part the same. Latter part light winds at 8 and over cast, at 4 A.M. saw a dead Whale, took the Whale a long side, saw the throat lips and half the head thus ends. Set by 5.14. N.

Monday June 12th

Commences with light winds at 8 and over cast, at 4 P.M. commenced Bailing, & Ship in sight, one a Bailing Middle part, thick rainy weather, at 4 P.M. the fog lifted up, saw several whales, however and Darter, the fog shut in thick gave up the chase and came on Board, thus ends with thick fog. No. 66

Tuesday June 13th

Commences with moderate weather, and thick fog. At 4 P.M. the fog lifted up, saw a whale, however without success. Middle and Latter part light winds and thick fog, at 10 A.M. the fog lifted up, saw a whale, however and struck, the line got out, the fog shut in thick gave up the chase and came on Board, thus ends. Wednesday June 14th

Commences with light winds and thick as usual saw several Whales, did not however, Middle part moderate, and thick fog. Latter part light winds at 6 and over cast, at 6 A.M. saw a Whale, at 7 commenced and pursued, and came on Board, saw more Whales however and chased with out success, & Ship in sight thus ends. No. 66

Thursday June 15th

Commences with light winds at 8 and over cast, Middle and Latter part the same, saw Whales however and chased and Darter with out success, and Ship in sight, so ends. No. 66

Thursday June 16th

All there 24 hours light winds, and over cast, at 1 P.M. saw Whales, however and struck 2 Whales, drove from one and got the other, at 4 commenced cutting, cut in the head throat and lips, bled by the Whale thrown right, Latter part finished cutting and commenced Bailing, thus ends.

Friday June 17th

Commences with light winds and calms, and over cast, at 1 P.M. saw a Whale, however, and struck, got one Boat alone Bad, the fog shut in thick. Cut from the Whale and lost him, Middle and Latter part much the same, Employed Bailing & Stowing down, thus ends.

Saturday June 18th

Commences with light winds and calms, saw one Whale, did not however, Employed in Stowing down, Middle and Latter part a moderate breeze and variable, at daylight saw 3 or 4 Whales, however and struck 2 Whales, drove from one, got one Whale spouting Blm, the line parted it shut in thick foggy with rain, and lost the Whales Employed in Bailing. No. 66

Sunday June 19th

Commences with a moderate breeze and thick weather. Middle and Latter part fine weather, at Midnight finished Bailing. Latter part Employed Stowing down saw several Whales however and chased and Darter with out success, and Ship in sight & Bailing thus ends. Set by 5.2.94. N. Long by 4.15.16 West

Tuesday June 20th

Commences with moderate weather, Employed in Stowing up the Main Hatchway, saw Whales however quick did not however, Middle and Latter part a fresh breeze at 8 and over cast, at 4 P.M. saw Whales however with out success, and Ship in sight, thus ends.
