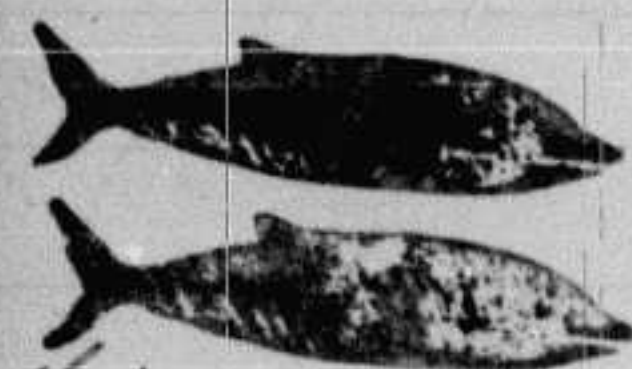


Ship Montpelier Making the best of her

Sunday March 22nd

Commences with a brisk breeze at West and southerly weather. Ship heading N. all powder sail set. At 2 P.M. Finched Boiling, Middle and Latter parts fresh breezes and varying from West to South, steered per Compass. All powder sail set, saw Nothing, thus ends

Set by Ch 39.14.9. South. Long by Chno 56.15. West



Monday March 23rd

Commences with a fresh breeze at S and pleasant, steered N. N. E. all drawing sail set. Middle part light winds and varying from S to S. E. steered N. E. by N. Latter part calm, employed Coopering the Oil and steaming down, saw Nothing, thus ends

Set by Ch 38.28. S. Long by Chno 55.38. West

Tuesday March 24th

Commences with light airs and calms, at 4 P.M. finished steaming down, Middle part much the same, Latter part a fresh breeze at N and overcast. Ship standing on different tacks to keep on the edge of the Banks, saw Nothing, thus ends

Set by Ch 38.20. S. Long by Chno 52.34. West

Wednesday March 25th

Commences with fresh breezes at N and overcast. Ship standing on different tacks, Middle and Latter part strong winds at N by W. & N. E. by N. Ship heading N. E. by E. & N. E. by N. Coasting all powder sail, saw Nothing. Employed warmsley, thus ends

Set by Ch 38.03. S. Long by Chno 49.23. West

Thursday March 26th

Commences with strong winds at N. W. by N. and rough. Ship under two reef Topsails. Fell & Foresail heading N. E. by N. Middle part much the same, Latter part more moderate, with thick overcast weather, the wind N. W. Ship heading N. N. E. all powder sail set, saw Nothing, employed vainesley, thus ends

Friday March 27th

Commences with light winds at N. W. and thick overcast weather. Middle part light airs at S. and calm, with rain, steered N. Latter part light airs and variable, with fine pleasant weather, saw Nothing. Employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Set by Ch 37.10. S. Long by Chno 53.06. West

Saturday March 28th

Commences with a light breeze at S and fine pleasant weather. Ship steering N. all drawing sail set. Middle part light baffling airs and calms, Latter part a light breeze at West and pleasant, steered N. saw Nothing. Employed in Ship's duty, thus ends

Set by Ch 36.55. S. Long by Chno 52.30.

Sunday March 29th

Commences with a light breeze at West and fine weather, steering N. N. E. by N. Signified with a English Breeze, steering South. Middle and Latter parts light baffling airs and calms, Nothing in sight, thus ends

Set by Ch 36.17. S. Long by Chno 51.46

Monday April 1st 1811

All there 24 hours light baffling airs and calms, at daylight on bent the Main Topsail & bent a weather-vane, saw six small Finches. Employed repairing the Main Topsail, thus ends

Set by Ch 35.47. S. Long by Chno 52.03. West

Tuesday April 2nd

Commences with a light breeze at East and fine pleasant weather, steering N. saw plenty of Finches, at sunset finished the Main Topsail, Middle and Latter parts a brisk breeze from S. E. to E. N. E. steered N. by E. & N. saw Nothing of any account, employed repairing the Fore Topsail, thus ends

Set by Ch 32.12. S.
