Sunday April 21st

All these 24 hours fine breezes from S & S to N.E. and pleasant
Ship steering W by S to S.W. At midnight bled by the rain
with the head yards a back headed S & S at 5 A.M. steered W
At daylight saw land bearing per compass N.W. by W. Cleared
the ship up headed N by W. At 8 A.M. past ship. Day some
heading East at 10 A.M. made out the Red of Guam?
bearing N.W. W. Distant 10 Mils. 2 sail in sight. This ends

Monday April 22nd

Commences with a fresh breeze at N.E. and fine weather
Ship steering per the Bury. At 5 P.M. discharged 12 barrels. At
daylight sent a raft on shore 1/2 of 14 casks and took them
to the ship. All hands Employed Working Ship. This ends

Tuesday April 23rd

All these 24 hours light winds and fine pleasant weather
All hands Employed painting, by Working and cleaning
Ship Painting yards and Blacking. Superstitions. Shirts & Toys &c

Wednesday April 24th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather. Employed
Painting of parts of Ship. One Watch a shore on Liberty

Thursday April 25th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather. Employed
Painting of parts of Ship. One Watch a shore on Liberty

Friday April 26th

All these 24 hours fine weather. One Watch a shore
on Liberty. Employed Painting Ship

Saturday April 27th

Commences with fine weather. At 3 P.M. Discharged
Williams Wilson. At 11 A.M. Discharged Elias Brown
and William Parsons. Discharged then 1 cask.
Employed Painting Ship. One Watch a shore on
Liberty. This ends

Red of Guam. 1 part of April & May. 1844.

Sunday April 28th

All these 24 hours fine weather. One Watch a shore on
Liberty. 3 Men have been absent 48 hours probably
Brought. This ends

Monday April 29th

All these 24 hours fine weather. Employed Painting Ship
got one Boat load of wood. One Watch a shore on Liberty

Tuesday April 30th

All these 24 hours fine weather. Employed Painting Ship
At 4 A.M. Delivered 12 bbls oil to Mrs. Silva and Watch a
shore on Liberty. Spencer Hugwood Discharged. Has been
absent 3 Days.

Wednesday May 1st

Commences with fine weather. At 1 P.M. the Captain
left the Ship for a Village Distant 15 Mils. On Business
Employed Painting Ship. One Watch a shore on
Liberty. At 4 A.M. Delivered to Antonio 7 1/2 bbls oil.
