

Sunday April 20th

Commences with fine pleasant weather saw one Whale Landed to no purpose 3 Ships in sight at sunset took in sail and spoke Ship while Hambleton of New Bedford was here. At daylight made sail one Ship in sight saw no Whales. Steered E. Lat & Lb 34.14. N Long & Lb 132.33.

Saturday April 21st

Commences with light winds at W & W sun shining but Ships at 5 P.M. spoke Ship Julian Baker New Bedford 800 tons. French Men London 1200 at sunset took in sail at daylight made sail 4 Ships in sight at 4 P.M. spoke Ship George Paul Trip New Bedford at 11 A.M. saw 2 or 3 Whales Landed to no purpose.

Sunday April 22nd

Commences with a fine breeze at S.W. Clothing in sight but Ships at sunset took in sail. Latter part strong breezes at S.W. at daylight made sail one Ship in sight. Ship heading W & W. All prudent sail set.

Monday April 23rd

Commences with a brisk breeze at N.W. Ship heading W & W 2 Ships in sight at sunset took in sail. Middle and Latter part light seas and calm at daylight made sail saw Whales Landed and chased several Whales to no purpose 2 Ships in sight and cutting.

Tuesday April 24th

Commences with light winds and fine weather with a plenty of Whales in sight Boats in Chase of Whales to no purpose 4 Ships in sight at sunset took in sail Latter part Chasing Whales dated twice to no purpose 5 Ships in sight. Lat & Lb 34.24. S

Wednesday April 25th

Commences with a fine breeze at S. Employed Chasing Whales at sunset took in sail and spoke Ship Julian 7 Ships in sight at daylight made sail saw Whales Landed and parted and parted the Line chased several Whales to no purpose 3 Ships in sight Ends with thick sunny weather the wind S.E. Employed Chasing new Lines. Lb Lb 132.55

Thursday April 26th

Commences with strong breezes at S.E. with a rain storm inclining on to a gale at 4 P.M. took in sail saw several Whales. Middle and Latter part fresh gales from S.E. evening to E and S.E. and S. Ship under short sail one Ship in sight.

Lat by Lb 34.19. N Long Lb 132.54 E

Friday April 27th

Commences with fresh gales at N.W. inclining to moderate made sail as caution required Ship heading N.E. at 6 P.M. more Ship to the W. Middle and Latter part strong winds at N. saw Whales Landed to no purpose 3 Ships in sight.
