



Wednesday July 11th
Commences with a fine breeze at 8. saw a long
Whale. Leeward part of kilt and at 8 P.M. took the
Whale a long side, plenty of small Whales in
sight. At 2 A.M. commences cutting latter part fresh
breezes at 8 A.M. No obs.

Thursday July 12th
Commences with fresh gales at 8 A.M. All hands
employed cutting the Whale. At 3 P.M. finished
Middle and latter part variable with thick
fog and rain. Employed Boiling and raising
up Shocks, saw Nothing. No obs.

Friday July 13th
Commences with light airs and Calms with
thick fog. Middle and latter part much the
same saw Nothing. Employed Boiling and
raising up Shocks. No obs.

Saturday July 14th
Commences with a fresh breeze at 8 A.M. with fog
steering N.E. and under short sail at 2 P.M.
spoke Bargee Prudent with Steam Tug
800 tons. Middle part the same, J. latter part
fresh gales & with overcast weather steering
N.E. by N. under short sail saw Nothing. Employed
Boiling. No obs.



Sunday July 15th
Commences with fresh gales at 8. Steaming
N.E. by N. Nothing in sight. Employed Boiling
middle part more moderate at 11 P.M. saw Whales
at 3 A.M. Person fastened on kilt at 5 A.M. took the
Whale a long side at 10 blowing a strong gale
Employed Boiling and steaming down 3 Ships
in sight, 40 Whales a long side. No obs.

Monday July 16th
Commences with strong gales at 8. Middle and latter
part hard gales. Cleared up the Main Top sail and put the
2nd Chain on to the Whale. Employed Boiling and Steaming
down Oil. at 4 A.M. finished Boiling 3 Ships in sight
No obs.

Tuesday July 17th
Commences with hard gales at 8. Employed Steaming
down Oil. Middle and latter part more Moderate
at 3 A.M. commenced cutting the Whale and Ship in sight
cutting. No obs. thick fog and rain.

Wednesday July 18th
Commences with light airs and Calms with a heavy
small and thick fog. Employed cutting at 1 P.M.
the fog lifted up saw the Leeward under our lee close
a Barge at 2 P.M. finished cutting and spoke a French Ship
Capt. Smith, more Ship at the same time, and made
all sail heading S.E. light airs from South. at 5 P.M.
it blowing on to a strong gale from South. took
in sail as cargo required. All hands Employed
Clearing up the Decks and lashing up, 9 P.M. part
a Ship laying to anchor Boiling, Middle and latter
part fresh gales at 8 with fog and rain. Employed
Boiling and steaming down, one Ship in sight.

Thursday July 19th
Commences with strong gales at 8 with fog and
rain. Employed Boiling and steaming down. Middle
part much the same. Latter part more moderate
saw Nothing. Employed Boiling and steaming down
at 8 by 6 24.27. N. Long by 168.57. W.
