

Thursday July 19<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a light breeze at 8 1/2 Ship heading  
S 1/4 N Nothing in sight Employed Bailing and stowing  
downs latter part light winds at 8 At 10 M saw  
St Lawrence Islands beginning per compass S 8 distant  
30 Mib, cleared S W & Employed Bailing  
Lat by Ch 64.11. N Long by Chron 172.34. W

Friday July 20<sup>th</sup>

Commences with a moderate breeze at 8 and clear  
Nothing in sight but St Lawrence Islands  
steering S W At 2 P M bent the Starboard Chain at 4  
shifted Foreails at Midnight finished Bailing  
latter part a fresh breeze at 8 steered N 1/4 E saw  
Nothing but 4 Ships, Employed stowing down oil  
No obs thick overcast weather

Saturday July 21<sup>st</sup>

Early Commences with a fresh breeze at 8 with fog  
signals Nothing in sight but the Land Employed  
stowing down oil, middle and latter part light  
airs and calm with thick fog most of the time  
plenty of small Whales round the Ship, Employed  
stowing down oil

Lat by a group of the Sun 64.50. S  
by Chron 172.34. W

Sunday July 22<sup>nd</sup>

Commences with light airs at 8 with thick fog  
signals at 8 P M finished stowing down oil  
Middle part fog by latter part light winds  
at 8 1/2 Ship heading N 1/2 E saw a plenty of  
small Whales, Employed variously

Lat by Ch 64.49. N Long by Chron 172.04. W

Monday July 23<sup>rd</sup>

Commences with fine pleasant weather and light airs  
at 8 1/2 W marking to the S the Land in sight and  
a plenty of small Whales in sight, Middle and latter part  
fine weather and 6 Ships saw several Whales Landed  
to no purpose at 3 A M spoke Ship Hammett West  
Maine Bear fur, 2,000 bbls, Employed raising up Shacks  
Lat by Ch 65.24. N

Tuesday July 24<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fresh breezes at 8 morning at  
fog 8 Ships in sight At 2 P M spoke Ship  
Shurham Barker, Barker of New Bedford 1000 bbls  
Middle and latter part fresh gales at 8 with thick  
fog Ship standing on Apperight tacks All prudent  
sail set saw a plenty of Whales at 10 M saw several  
but the fog shut in thick called the Boats on Board  
at 4 P M set up Anchor in 28 fathoms  
Employed raising up Shacks

Wednesday July 25<sup>th</sup>

Commences with fresh breezes at 8 with thick  
fog Ship at anchor Employed variously raising  
up Shacks starting to calum and stowing a  
way things, middle part thick fog latter part  
light airs and calm with clear weather saw a plenty  
of Whales Landed to no purpose Whales many that  
Ship began to anchor close to the Land saw plenty  
of Indians to run on Board

Thursday July 26<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light airs and calm plenty of Whales in  
sight but could not get past Middle and latter part  
the same Ship at anchor
