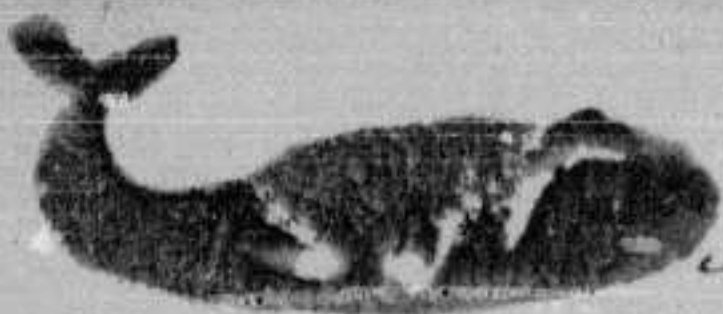




Monday August 6th

Commences with light airs at N with fog squalls, plenty of Whales in sight gaining quick to the N. Employed stowing oil and raising up Hooks At 3 P.M. Dipped for a Whale fastened and killed 5 Mils from the ship at 10 P.M. took the Whale a long side, better part fine pleasant weather Employed cutting the Whale saw the Scurians just to a Whale spouting thick Blue

Tuesday August 7th

Commences with a light breeze at S with fine weather At 5 P.M. finished cutting the Whale Ship at Anchor Middle and Latter part fine weather Employed Boiling and raising up Hooks

Wednesday August 8th

Commences with fine weather Ship at Anchor Employed Boiling and stowing oil, Middle and Latter part the same no Whales in sight Employed Boiling and raising up Hooks

Thursday August 9th

Commences with light winds at N with fog squalls Employed Boiling and raising up Hooks at 7 P.M. saw one Whale Landed to no purpose Middle and Latter part strong winds at N. saw nothing Employed Boiling and stowing oil, Ship at Anchor

Friday August 10th

Commences with moderate breezes from N. Nothing in sight Employed Boiling and stowing oil, at 11 P.M. finished Boiling Latter part Chasing Whales and Coopering Oil

Saturday August 11th

Commences with light airs at S. Employed stowing down oil, Middle and Latter part fresh winds at S. with thick fog Employed stowing oil, saw nothing

Sunday August 12th

Commences with fresh gales at S with thick fog and rain At 4 P.M. found the Ship cleaving let go the Starboard Anchor Middle part strong gale at S with a heavy sea Ship laboring hard and taking water over the Board At 4 P.M. the wind shifted to N.W. and quite moderate at 8 P.M. took the Starboard Anchor at 9 P.M. the wind blowing fresh with hard squalls, saw several Whales to rugged to Whale

Monday August 13th

Commences with fresh gales at N.W. and squally Ship at Anchor at 7 P.M. spoke Ship Cooper's Baker also Redford 17.00 lbs, Metoon Shakes 19.00 lbs Middle and Latter part light airs and hazy saw Whales but very shy at 10 P.M. took the Anchor plenty of Whales in sight gaining quick Chasing them with Ship and Boats, to no purpose 5 Ships in sight, East by S 65. N.E. etc.



Tuesday August 14th Commences

with a fine breeze at S and pleasant plenty of Whales in sight the Boats in chase of Whales At 2 P.M. fastened and killed at 4 took the Whale a long side and let go Anchor at 6 P.M. ~~fast~~ Commenced cutting, at 2 P.M. finished cutting it blowing a fresh gale at South with a heavy sea, the Ship at Anchor in 28 fathoms water with 75 fathoms of Chain, at 5 P.M. the wind S.E. and breezing on, At 6 P.M. the Ship commenced dragging the East Cape of India bearing for Company
