Thursday June 2nd

This day begins with thick foggy weather Strong
Breezes from E. S. E. Steaming N. W. E passed an
Iceberg at 3 P. M. Middle part raining latter part
the same Steaming N. E. ends this day
No Observation

Friday June 3rd

This day begins with thick foggy weather rain and
snow squalls wind S. E. Steaming N. E. saw two
Icebergs and small pieces of ice Middle part the
same latter part thick saw the sun Under whole
Main topsail and double reefed fore topsail and
Fore sail Steaming N. E. wind S. by E.
Lat 63. 29, long 53. 34

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Saturday June 4th

This day begins with snow squalls from S. by E
thick foggy weather light breeze saw the pack
at 11 P. M. Several icebergs in sight
Spoke the Brig Georganna of New London Capt
Thames middle part thick weather latter part
fog cleared away light winds on the Starboard tack
So ends the day

By compass Steaming N. W. E. Spoke the Bark
Antelope of New Bedford Capt. J. M. Middle part
latter part calm and fine clear weather
