Monday June 20th

This day begins with light winds from S.E. with thick weather crew employed in working on the rigging and fitting, whaling gear the three Captains one gunning middle part raining latter part clear and pleasant to ends the day

Tuesday June 21st

This day begins with thick weather wind S.W. and thick snow storm broke out water middle part raining weather latter part wind W clearing up

Wednesday June 22nd

This day begins with light winds from S.W. raining weather crew employed working on the rigging one boat went gunning got several ducks middle part snowing and raining latter part wind N.W. fine weather

Thursday June 23rd

This day begins with strong breeze from S.W. crew employed in tarring down rigging Capt Keene and Spicer come on board - Three vessels laying about 60 miles North from here middle part snow squalls latter part the same to ends this day

Friday June 24th

This day begins strong breeze from N.W. thick snow storm with but clear wind S.W. crew employed tarring down the rigging sent the spunkies latter part snow squalls ends the day

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Saturday June 25th

This day begins with thick weather and snow squalls wind S.W. crew employed in backing out the main hatch got 3 cask of water from shore flood down two cask middle part much the same latter part fine weather wind E.S.E. ends the day

Sunday June 26th

This day begins with raining weather wind N.W. flood down two boats to clear the cable middle part fine weather strong breeze wind N.W. latter part much the same to ends this day the Schooner S. B. Howe Capt. Spicer come to anchor at 10 P.M.

Monday June 27

This day begins with light winds from N.W. and raining weather two boat went out fishing saw a humpback whale middle part snowing and raining wind N.W. strong breeze latter part fine weather wind about the same the Schooner haul up how to repair her madder to ends this day

Tuesday June 28th

This day begins with strong breeze from S.W. and thick snow storm middle part much the same latter misty weather repaired a boat and backing grates for the by pots to ends this day
