Wednesday June 29th

This day begins with strong gale from S.W. raining and
 storm Middle part much the same latter
 part moderating and raining so ends the day

Thursday June 30th

This day begins with a rain storm wind S.W. have in
 the forenoon of chain employed in making grate
 for the log pot Middle part moderating and clearing up
 Two boats went fishing latter part fine weather wind
 shifted to E. N. E. so ends this day

Friday July 1st

This day begins with breeze from S.W. and rain storm
 Middle part much the same latter part moderating
 light winds and thick fog so ends this day

Saturday July 2nd

This day begins with strong breeze from S.W. and rain
 storm Middle part much the same got one cask of water
 from ashore latter part stop raining strong winds
 so ends this day

Sunday July 3rd

This day begins with a strong breeze from S.W. and rain
 storm middle clearing up wind shifted to S. E. latter
 part fine pleasant weather light winds have in stock
 chains so ends this day

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Monday July 4th

This day begins with fine pleasant weather Wind S.W.
 Two boats went fishing the capt went gunning
 crew employed in taring down the Backstays
 Middle part begins with rain wind S.W. latter part
 much the same hail squall and thick fog the boats
 returned with several ducks and fish so ends the day

Tuesday July 5th

This day begins with fine weather and light winds
 from S.W. weighed anchor at 11 A.M. towed out of
 the harbor in company with the Bark Black Eagle
 and Bark Antelope Middle part wind hauled slight
 thick fog latter part much the same light winds
 steering N. by E under all sail so ends this day

Wednesday July 6th

This day begins with a moderate breeze from N. by E
 with fine pleasant weather steering N. by E by
 compass employed in fitting whaling gear
 and sheaking decks middle part much the same
 the Black Eagle in company with us latter part
 light winds saw ice kept off steering N. spoke the
 Black Eagle so ends the day
 Lat 58.45 long 38.35

Thursday July 7th

This day begins with light winds from N. with clear
 weather steering N. by E by compass employed in
 painting the grates boats middle part the same latter part
 wind hauled S. by E in company with Bark Black Eagle
 Lat 62.54 long 66.12
 Bent ice in sight
