Friday July 27th

This day begins in the morning breeze from E. with thick fog
Reefed the topsail and put the main sail hoisted on the wind
Voice in sight sighted Edinburgh Island at 5 A.M. 20 miles Dist
Rising S. by E. middle part clear weather made sail kept off
Threading by a wind. Moderately employed in getting the
Cutting gear aloft latter part much the same the Black Eagle
Chilston and George and Mary in sight no ice in sight

Saturday July 28th

This day begins with strong breezes from E. with clear weather
Saw small streams of ice the Black Eagle in company with us
Sighted Cape Southampton at 5 A.M. bearing E. N. E. Dist 20 miles
Middle part light winds close haul steaming N. W. by E.
Employed in rearing the cutting fall latter part calm
Lat 61.30 long 85.39

Sunday July 31st

This day begins with calm clear weather middle part light
Winds the Bark Black Eagle in company with us the Capt came
in boat no ice in sight latter part moderate breeze from
N. W. by E. Steaming N. W. by E.
Lat 61.04 long 85.18

Monday August 1st

This day begins with light winds from S. W. by S. clear weather
Middle part strong breezes from S. E. employed in fitting
Re-cutting stage the Black Eagle in company with us latter
part much the same sighted Marble Island bearing
E. N. E. Dist 20 miles at 6 p.m.
Lat 62.58 long 91.13

Tuesday August 2nd

This day begins with fresh breezes from E. with rainy
weather the Black Eagle in company with us middle part
much the same sighted Rocky Point fine weather last sight
Of the Black Eagle latter part fine weather heading into the
Land sighted Cape Island bearing E. by N. Dist 8 miles

Wednesday August 3rd

This day begins with light baffling winds fine weather
At 4 A.M. saw the Bark Andrews Northern Light.
Daniel Webster Brig Seabellor the boat came on board
Broke out Road for Daniel Webster water particular
Cape Chilston bearing E. by N. Dist 4 miles
The mate went on board Northern Light

Thursday August 4th

This day begins with light winds fine weather
Heading along the land mid part much the same saw
Two whails and toward for them did not strike the
Northern Light struck a small whail latter part
Bright winds and calm the Bark Andrews struck a
Whail - Whail Bunt bearing E. by N. Dist 12 miles
Saw a boat in shore supposed to be natives steering N. E.

Friday August 5th

This day begins with moderate breezes from S. by E. fine
Weather Middle part much the same run through a
Stream of ice the Brig Seabellor and ship Daniel Webster
in sight latter part baffling winds and calm working
Up for Replun Bay saw several whales and white whails
11 miles from the land steaming on the wind to the North
End of Southampton Island
