Saturday August 6<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light, soft wind and clear weather. Plenty of field ice in sight middle part light winds and calm. The boat towing the vessel ice very scattering latter part Wind N.W. working through ice haul up 66 fathoms of chain. And Bent on the Starboard Anchor Repulse Bay suppose to be 20 miles Dist.

Sunday August 7<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with strong breezes from N.W. with thick weather. Capt went to sound out A harbor come Bo. anchor at 6 A.M. in 14 fathoms of water. Saw several Deer went on shore and killed 4 and one Bear. Middle part rainy and thick latter part much the same.

Monday August 8<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light winds from S.E. with fine weather. The boat went A whaling saw several whales that were very wild saw A vessel trying out suppose it to be the Antelope. Middle part rain squalls latter part light winds and calm rainy weather so ends this day.

Tuesday August 9<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light winds from S.W. and rainy. The boat went A whaling Middle part thick fog. Cleared up fine weather saw the whales did not strike. Saw the Bark Black Eagle off shore latter part strong breezes from S.E. saw some ice so ends this day.

Wednesday August 10<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with thick fog wind S.E. and the boat Bo. for A whail that came in the harbor middle part fog lit up the boat went whaling the Starboard boat stuck towed him to the beach and made him fast. Latter part rain squalls light winds.

Thursday August 11<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light winds from S.W. thick fog. At 10 A.M. weighed anchor 4 p.m. dropped anchor and towed the whail along side commence cutting at 10 p.m. Latter part rain squalls and calm saw the Antelope and Black Eagle off shore at anchor in 9 fathoms water.

Friday August 12<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with calm toward down the beach. The whail boat stuck towed him along side middle part fine weather wind N.W. saw several went after them. Bow boat stuck at 5 P.M. commence cutting. Anchored one whail under the feet of an island. Latter part fresh breezes.

Saturday August 13<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light winds and calm towed the whail along side commence cutting at 1 P.M. finish at 6 p.m. Middle part rain squalls wind N.W. Latter part commence bilging first buoy set the watch at 1 P.M. so ends this day.

Sunday August 14<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with strong gales from N.W. and raining employed in trying out. Middle part much the same dropped the starboard anchor with 66 fathoms of chain latter part moderating a little. So ends this day.
