Monday August 15th

This day begins with strong breeze from N. by E. thick weather employed in baling and breaking out water. Toward fore whails did not stick middle part much the same. Latter part saw up the Starbuck anchor calm and raining.

Tuesday August 16th

This day begins with strong breeze from N. W. and raining. Employed in trying out. Toward fore whails did not stick middle part much the same. Latter part saw down oil latter part much the same weather. Cold.

Wednesday August 17th

This day begins with strong breeze from N. W. and raining. Employed in stowing down middle part and about N. W. saw no whails latter part light winds fine weather. Finish stowing down cleared up decks so ends the day.

Thursday August 18th

This day begins with fresh breeze from N. W. thick weather boat went whaling. Saw two whails did not stick middle part wind N. E. and calm latter calm. Saw the Black Eagle trying out she is to be an anchor in A Harbor 6 miles from us.

Friday August 19th

This day begins with light winds from S. W. with foggy. Weighed anchor at 5 A.M. standing out of the bay middle part much the same fine weather saw stream of ice on the west shore. Water parts calm and thick weather. Saw no whails broke out water got A. Walrus.

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Saturday

August 20th

This day begins with light winds from S. W. and raining weather beating out of Repulse Bay very strong current middle part much the same saw sealing pieces of ice latter part baffling winds and fine weather. Standing along the land saw no whails.

Sunday August 21st

This day begins with light winds from S. by E. and thick weather. Stand out of the bay at 4 A.M. lashed ship haul. Back main yard thick fog at 6 A.M. fog lifted. Middle part baffling winds and calm latter part light winds from N. W. fine weather. off the mouth of wages river heading in to Southampton Island. A ship in sight.

Monday August 22nd

This day begins with light winds from N. by E. and fine weather. Saw whails toward fore whails did not stick saw two ships cutting in middle part baffling winds latter part saw the Anvil S. W. and N. W. them light try out the mate of the Gibbs came on board. Strong breeze from N. W. saw seven sail so ends the day.

Tuesday August 23rd

This day begins with light winds from S. W. by N. and thick foggy. Laying with the main yard aback middle part fog lit up saw a whail toward fore whails did not stick off whail down steaming down along the land latter part fresh breeze from S. W. and thick fog at 3 P.M. rounded S. W. for them near Cape Tuleton laying with the main yard aback.
