

1864

Saturday Nov 19th

this day begins with light winds from N.W. and fine weather. Toward the boats for whaling. Did not strike mid part moderate. Boats returned and finished stowing down. Cal. Later part light winds from S.W. and clear weather. Saw the Brig Clara Boat fast to a whale off shore.

Sunday Nov 20th

this day begins with fresh Gales from N.W. and clear weather employed in breaking out Flour Sugar Beans Tricladapples and water stowing down. Bone got two Barrels of sugar from the Brig Union mid and later part much the same. Schooner Teacher came in got nothing.

Monday Nov 21st

this day begins with fresh Gales from N.W. thick weather employed in breaking out Flour casks and clearing up Decks mid much the same. The Brig Clara Tricladapples in harbor and cutting and whale. The schooner Teacher went to Bear Island to the point making a little ice making very fast in the harbor.

1864

Tuesday Nov 22nd

this day begins with fresh Breezes from N.W. and clear weather. Toward the boats for whaling. Harbor Boat struck and towed him along side and began to cut at 8 p.m. and finished at 10 p.m. mid and later part much the same. Ice making very fast in the harbor.

Wednesday Nov 23rd

this day begins with fresh Breezes from N.W. and thick weather at 8 p.m. Heighed. Anchoress dropped Anchor in harbor on the North side of Harrisons Island very bold mid part much the same. The schooner Teacher paid all the chain in Harbor Cable could not do anything to mid Wind. Later part much the same plenty of ice in the harbor.

Thursday Nov 24th

this day begins with light winds N.W. clear weather employed in the evening. Anchoress did not go the Starbird. Anchoress ship freezing in ice made two miles off shore clearing Bone and stowing down. Scraping Decks and cutting up Bone. Teacher came in.

Friday Nov 25th

this day begins with light winds from N.W. thick weather employed in breaking out Flour and casks mid part moderating and evening cutting up Flour and the Top sail for Hank quarters. The part much the same. Boats out and water.
