Sprits below This day begins with light air and calms and
 Morning 15° Snow storm the boat and third mate went to Black
 Night 10° Lead Island and returned the crew employed in digging
 out from under the snow mid and latter
 Part much the same weather very mild the Cooper found
 this weather full with shavings bought it of
 Done & Williams for 4 weeks matters

Thursday Feb 9th

Spits below This day begins with light air and calms with thick
 Morning 10° Weather clearing a little mid part strong breeze from
 Night 4° S.W. with clear weather employed in making out flour
 Beans cranberries and Boley latter part weather much
 the same

Friday Feb 10th

Sprits below This day begins with strong wind from S.W. with a
 Morning 1° Thick snow storm mid part wind hauled to N.W.
 Night 7° Strong breeze latter part much the same

Saturday Feb 11th

Sprits below This day begins with light air and calms
 Morning 12° Clear weather broke out no classes second and
 Night 16° Fourth mate and two boat crews went to
 Black Lead Island mid and latter parts much
 the same Water in sight 12 miles from the ship

Sunday Feb 12th

Spits below This day begins with light air and calms clear cold
 Morning 31° Weather mid and latter part much the same water in
 Night 21° Light from the ship 4 boat crews came on board from
 the schooner to make this trip

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Monday Feb 13th

Spits below This day begins with light air and calms and clear cold
 Morning 21° Weather employed in hauling one load of ice two families of
 Night 22° Nature has moved up to an island 12 miles distant on
 Family went over to Black Lead Island to day mid and latter
 Part weather much the same water in sight
 Broke out some clay for the galley

Tuesday Feb 14th

Spits below This day begins with light air from S.W. and calm cold
 Morning 24° Weather mid and third mate went to Black Lead Island and
 Night 21° Returned another family of natives went over to the island
 Capt. Newbury Mr. Butcher and Mr. Morgan came hear to
 Lay the Butcher and Mr. Morgan left soon after for the
 Brig the Boat crews left for the day also mid and
 Latter part weather the same

Wednesday Feb 15th

Spits below This day begins with calm clear weather Capt. Newbury
 Morning 16° Went to his schooner mid part much the same Capt. Morgan
 Night 12° And a boat crew came hear latter part weather the same
 Water in sight 10 miles from the ship

Thursday Feb 16th

Spits below This day begins light air and clear weather
 Morning 13° Broke out 4 cask of Bread Capt. Newbury came hear
 Night 21° The three Capt. went over to Black Lead Island Capt.
 Allen returned mid and latter part much the same
 Water in sight
