

March - 1786 -

Raising his head out of the water; after some time he Recover'd his breath, but was not very Senceable, the other boat being a considerable way from us, we wait'd to them as well as we could and they soon Discover'd our Situation and as soon as possible came to our Relief and by the good providence of god we all got safe aboard the Brig again, Except the Capt. who Remains very poorly and is fear'd very much hurt - the after part of this Day was Exceeding Stormy weather the wind N.E. So End this 24 hours all of us alive thanks be to god - No obs. this Day

Thursday y^e 23^d the wind Hall'd Round to the S.W. and about Eight o'clock A.M. it Clear'd off and was good weather again, We made sail and stood off E. N.E.
Lat: by obs. 29-14

Friday y^e 24th was fine weather and a fine Gail of wind at S.W. we made our Course S.W. & N. Very Desirable Course for us at this time, for We conclude to make the best of our way for America by way of the west India.
Lat: by obs. 28-31

Saturday y^e 25th good weather and a very Desirable gail of wind at S.W. we made our Course N.E. and were by obs. in Lat: 27-49

Sunday y^e 26th Fair weather and a Steady Breeze of wind Remained at S.W. by us. We made our Course N.E. - Lat: 26-16

Monday y^e 27th pleasant weather and a small Breeze of wind at S. we sent up our top gallant yard this Day and set the sail and made our Course N.E. and were by obs. in Lat: 25-35

March - 1786 -

Tuesday y^e 28th Remained pleasant weather, but the wind Hall'd Round to N.E. & at Twelve o'clock we Tack'd Ship and stood Eastward and were by obs. in Lat: 24-59

Wednesday y^e 29th fair weather and a Brisk gale of wind at N.E. we made our Course E. Lat: by obs. 25-39

Thursday y^e 30th Remained fair weather and Brisk Gales of wind attended from S. we Steer'd E.S.E. and Nothing more Remarkable Excepting a fine Litter of pigs which came of a Sow that we had from the western Islands. Lat: by obs. 25-56

Friday y^e 31st Remained good weather, but a Light Breeze of wind at N.W. we Steer'd N.E. and were by obs. in Lat: 25-32 about Seven o'clock P.M. the wind Hall'd Round to the Eastward and we Jib'd Ship and stood N.

Saturday y^e 1st this 24 hours was attended with a Light Breeze of wind and fair weather, we made our Course N. and by obs. in Lat: 24-45

Sunday y^e 2^d Remained fair weather, Excepting some Light Squalls of Rain and wind from N.W. We could head no better than N.W. by us for the greater part of the Day. Lat: by obs. 24-24 at four o'clock P.M. the wind Hall'd Round to N.E. Then we put about and stood to the Eastward

Monday y^e 3^d Moderate gales and fair weather. We kept the same Course as above by obs. in Lat: 24-27
