Made our course for St. Eustatia

Sunday y^e 28th Ran into the Harbour
at St. Eustatia and there Came to anchor

Monday y^e 29th Still Lay in the Harbour

Tuesday y^e 30th Lay in the Harbour till about
Eight of clock P.M. then weighed anchor and
off N. E. for the Coast of America
Myself and Two others on board Very poorly

Wednesday y^e 31st fair weather and a fine
Gale of wind - our Lat. by obsⁿ 18-40
we Sailed in Company with a brig from
Santucket Cap^t Moore. Commander

Thursday y^e 1st good weather Lat - 21 -

Friday y^e 2nd fair weather and Moderate gales of
Wind Lat. by obsⁿ 23-07 - which occasioned a Diffute

Gales of wind - our true Lat. by obsⁿ 24-0

Sunday y^e 4th Remained Moderate weather
and Light Breezes of wind - Lat. by obsⁿ 25-40
We who were taken poorly, still remain
So, myself in Especial manner am so very
Weak and my Senses so Effete that I
must be obliged to quit writing

I Remained Sick the whole of the
Passage untill we arrived at Boston
Which was on the 17th Day of June 1786

Thanks be to god the fever had in a great
Measure Left me, but was Extremely
Weak and Relaxed being almost worn
out by Reason of the Vessels Rolling
and Tumbling which prevented my
Taking any proper Rest
