Sunday July 15th 1855

Begins with Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward under Double Reef at 5 P.M. raises to hauls at 5 1/2 lowered two Boats but it was too late to get to them before dark at 6 1/2 were Ship to the Southward under Short Sail. at 6 A.M. were to the Southward.

Lat 5-14 Long 115-00



Monday July 16th 1855

Begins with fresh Trades Steering to the Westward at 5:30 P.M. tacked to on the Northern tack at 7 A.M. tacked to the Southward. Saw Squid.

Tuesday July 17th

Begins with Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. at 12 tacked to the S.E. Latter part Employed Battering but between decks. Saw a Pin Back.

Wednesday July 18th

Begins with Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the S.E. at 3 A.M. tacked to the Southward at 6 A.M. commenced Battering but meat to resalt it.

Thursday July 19th

Begins with Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. Employed resalting the Beef. at 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 11 1/2 A.M. spoke the Bark. Retained since 12 months 355. Lat 5-02 Long 114-10

Friday July 20th

Begins with fresh Trades Steering by the wind to the S.E. Latter part Employed resalting beef at 11 1/2 A.M. finishing. Saw a Pin Back.

Saturday July 21st

Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the S.E. the bark in sight. at 12 tacked to the Southward. Saw nothing. Lat 4-32 Long 114-33

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Sunday July 22nd 1855

Begins with Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. Saw a large Splice of fresh Splice. at 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 6 1/2 A.M. tacked to the Southward. Saw nothing. Lat 5-05 Long 114-50

Monday July 23rd

Begins with strong Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. Saw the Bark to Landward. at 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E. Latter part saw a number of Pin Backs

Tuesday July 24th

Begins with strong Trades Steering by the wind to the S.E. at 1 1/2 P.M. a man fell over board but he was a good swimmer we lowered a boat and picked him up. Latter part saw Porpoises. at 6 A.M. tacked to the S.E.

Wednesday July 25th

Begins with fresh Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. at 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E. at 7 A.M. tacked to the Southward. Lat 4-59

Thursday July 26th

Begins with pleasant Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. at 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E. Latter part fine Saw Squid. Lat 4-30 Long 114-30

Friday July 27th

Begins with light Trades and fine weather. at 1 1/2 P.M. saw to hauls. at 2 1/2 lowered the 1st Boat struck and cut for foul line. the 2d 3d truck and took and took him to the Ship. at 5 P.M. at 6 A.M. commenced Battering. at 9 finishing. Lat 4-26 Long 115-20



Saturday July 28th

Begins with Strong Trades Steering by the wind to the Southward. Employed clearing away the whale. Latter part Employed Battering. Lat 4-31 Long 115-35
