

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Brewell Master.

Sunday August 12th 1835

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.E. steering
by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part fresh breezes from
the Southward. Steering E. Lat 4-34 Long 111-12

Monday August 13th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward. Steering
E. Latter part strong breezes. Saw nothing.

Lat 4-39 Long 109-10

Tuesday August 14th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward.
at 3 1/2 P.M. saw whales breaching to the windward.
at 5 1/2 P.M. the Starboard lance & Boats struck.
at 9 P.M. took them to the ship. Long 108-58

at 6 A.M. commenced cutting the whales. at 9 1/2
finished. Lat 4-41

Wednesday August 15th

Begins with strong breezes from the Southward
and squalls. Lat 5-12 P.M. finished clearing
the whales. Lat 6-12 took ship to the Eastward.
at 5 1/2 A.M. commenced boiling.

Thursday August 16th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward.
steering by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part
pleasant. at 5 A.M. finished boiling the whales. they
made 3000.

Friday August 17th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.E.
steering by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part
light breezes and fine weather. Steering to the
Eastward. caught a Porpoise.

Saturday August 18th

Begins with light breezes from the Southward steering
by the wind to the E. Latter part saw nothing.

Sunday August 19th 1835

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward and
squalls steering by the wind to the Eastward.
Latter part fine Lat 5-25 Long 102-00

Monday August 20th

Begins with Pleasant breezes from the Southward. Steering E by S.
Latter part fresh breezes from the Southward. Saw White
Rocks.

Tuesday August 21st

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward.
steering by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part
fine Comptonia in starting water. Lat 2-48 Long 93-16

Wednesday August 22nd

Begins with fine breezes from the Southward. Steering
to the Eastward. Latter part squally. Saw fin back.
Lat 2-56 Long 96-13

Thursday August 23rd

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southward and squally.
Saw Porpoises and few fish. Latter part saw nothing.
Lat 2-56 Long 94-13

Friday August 24th

Begins with strong breezes from the Southward and squalls.
steering by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part
fine & the watch employed making a fish trap.
Lat 2-06

Saturday August 25th

Begins with light breezes from the S.E. steering
by the wind to the Eastward. at 1 P.M. on a crest
the Island of Culpeper bearing S by E Dist
35 miles. at 6 P.M. bearing S by E Dist 20 miles
Latter part fine saw Porpoises. Culpeper still
in sight bearing S by E Dist 20 miles.
