

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Crowell Master.

Sunday August 26th 1855

Begins with light Breezes from the S. S. E.
Steering by the wind to the Eastward. at 6 P.M.
Culpeper Bearing S. S. E. Dist 5 miles. Commans
Island Bearing S. E. Dist 35 miles. at 8 1/2 A.M.
Saw a hump back whale and her calf. at 9 saw
Breeches and tacked for them, but saw them no more.

Monday August 27th

Begins with fine Breezes from the Southern
Steering by the wind to the W. S. W. at 5 1/2 P.M. Ship
to the Eastward. the wind very light. at 6 Commans
Island Bearing S. E. Dist 3 miles. Latter
part light Breezes at 8 1/2 the Capt went on shore
fishing. at 10 1/2 returned with a fine mess of fish.

Tuesday August 28th

Begins with light Breezes from the Southern.
Steering by the wind to the S. S. E. at 6 P.M.
the Island bearing to S. W. Dist 35 miles. Latter
part strong Breeze. Saw a hump back. Abington's
Island in sight Lat 1-18

Wednesday August 29th

Begins with strong Breezes from the S. S. E.
Steering by the wind to the Eastward. Latter
part squally. Saw fin back Lat 1-13 Long 83-45

Thursday August 30th

Begins with strong Breezes from the Southern.
Saw squalls. Steering by the wind to the Eastward
Latter part employed showing down Oil

Friday August 31st

Begins with pleasant Breezes from the Southern
Steering by the wind to the Eastward. at
6 P.M. finished showing down. Latter part saw a sail

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Saturday September 1st 1855

Begins with fresh Breezes from the Southern.
Steering by the wind to the Eastward. two sails
in sight at 6 1/2 A.M. tacked to the Westward.
Saw two sails. Lat 0-55. Long 84-30

Sunday Sept 2nd

Begins with pleasant Breezes. Steering by the wind
to the W. S. W. at 3 P.M. raised the hauls and
lowered the boats. the S. and W. S. struck the
W. S. got stove. the S. Boat whale drew the Iron
from him. the S. Boat struck and saved the whale
the S. Boat saved the line. at 7 took them to the
Ship and prepared for cutting. at 6 A.M.
Commenced cutting. at 10 finished. Lat 0-52 85-20
S. B. 30 W. B. 10

Monday Sept 3rd

Begins with strong Breezes from the Southern.
Employed clearing away the whales. at 6 P.M.
finished and cleared up. at 8 1/2 P.M. commenced
Boiling

Tuesday Sept 4th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the Southern
and squalls. Employed boiling. at 2 P.M. finished
Boiling. the whale turned up. at 3 1/2.

Wednesday Sept 5th

Begins with light Breezes from the Southern
Steering by the wind to the Eastward. at 5 P.M.
tacked to the Eastward. the Capt employed repairing
the W. S. Boat. at 6 P.M. tacked to the Eastward.
Latter part squally. Lat 0-53

Thursday Sept 6th

Begins with light Breezes from the Southern
Steering by the wind to the Eastward. Saw a 3rd
hank to the Westward. at 4 A.M. tacked to the
Westward. Saw two sails. Lat 1-56
