

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Crowell Master.

Friday September 1<sup>st</sup> 1855

Begins with pleasant breezes from the Southward.  
Steering by the wind to the Westward. Employed  
Refraining the Boat. at 4 P.M. finished her. at 6  
locked to the S.O. Latter part fine. Lat 2-28

Saturday Sept 2<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with moderate breezes from the Southward.  
at 5 1/2 P.M. spoke the Bark Witten Snow left  
about 12 months out for 1855. Latter part light  
breezes. 4 sails in sight. Lat 2-23

Sunday Sept 3<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with light breezes from the S.O.  
Steering by the wind to the Eastward at 5 1/2  
P.M. put the Boat out on the trawls.  
Latter part strong breezes. at 10 A.M. took in the Ballast  
Sails. saw a Bark towing to Westward

Lat 2-39 Long 82-40

Monday Sept 4<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from the Southward steering  
by the wind to the Eastward. No water seen from the  
Soundings. Latter part fine. Saw Black fish

Lat 3-04

Tuesday Sept 5<sup>th</sup>

Begins with pleasant breezes. Steering in for  
the Land. at 3 P.M. raised it. at 4 A.M. went  
the chains. at 6 came too at 7 A.M. in  
bathings of water. Latter part Employed cooping  
Mollusks.

Wednesday Sept 6<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather. Employed stowing oil  
and washing ship. at 4 A.M. the Capt. went on shore  
at 6 P.M. returned. at 4 the Mary Ann of Fair  
haven came to anchor. 12 months 5-50 lbs.

Thursday Sept 12<sup>th</sup> 1855

Begins with fine weather. Employed getting on board  
supplies

Friday Sept 13<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breezes with a strong tide in the river

Saturday Sept 14<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breezes and under a heavy swell. Employed  
getting off supplies of wood and water.

Sunday Sept 15<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breezes at 9 A.M. sent a quarter watch  
on liberty

Monday Sept 16<sup>th</sup>

Pleasant weather. Employed getting wood and stowing  
water. One of our crew was taken prisoner by a  
Peruvian Brig of war for using Dirk knives and  
Pistols to freely in a row on shore.

Tuesday Sept 17<sup>th</sup>

Pleasant weather. Employed painting ship and  
fitting rigging. at 9 A.M. sent one third of the crew  
on liberty.

Wednesday Sept 18<sup>th</sup>

fine weather. Employed getting water and Potatoes.  
at 5 1/2 P.M. the liberty men came on board with exceptions that was  
to drink. and that I ascertained by the name of Wilcox.

Thursday Sept 19<sup>th</sup>

fine weather. at 8 A.M. sent the last watch on liberty.  
Capt. Crowell and Mr. Hampton had some words  
about whaling. and Mr. Kemp gave up his vote to  
Mr. Rogers. Mr. R. said that he wanted his discharge  
it was finally enacted in a dissatisfied row

Friday 20<sup>th</sup>

at 9 A.M. Mr. R. went on shore. at 6 P.M. the watch  
returned to the ship minus one man.
