First part light Breezes from the S.E. steering
by the wind to the Southward. at 6 P.M. tacked
to the N.E. Latter part fine.

Saturday Dec 1st 1855

First part pleasant Breezes from the S.E.
steering by the wind to the S.E. at 6 P.M.
tacked to the Southward. Latter part fine saw
the Annet Libb's cutting a whale

Sunday Dec 2nd

First part Pleasant Breezes from the S.E.
steering by the wind to the Southward. Latter
part like the A Libb's in light Boiling.

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Monday December 3rd 1855

First part fine Breezes from the Eastward
steering by the wind to the S.E. at 4 P.M.
tacked to the N.E. Latter part fine employed
starting water and trimming ship
P Lat 5-09 Long 107-00

Tuesday Dec 4th

First part fine Breezes from the S.E. steering by
the wind to the Eastward. Latter part strong wind
at 7 A.M. tacked to the Southward. Saw Fin Back
P Lat 4-57 Long 106-21

Wednesday Dec 5th

First part strong Breezes from the S.E. steering by
the wind to the Southward at 6 P.M. tacked to the
N.E. and Double Reefed. Latter part fine employed
repairing sails
P Lat 4-38 Long 106-00

Thursday Dec 6th

First part Pleasant Breezes from the S.E.
steering by the wind to the S.E. employed
repairing sails. Latter part fine saw Fin Back
P Lat 4-33 Long 105-40

Friday Dec 7th

First part pleasant Breezes from the S.E. steering by
the wind to the S.W. at 6 P.M. tacked to the N.E.
at 6 1/2 Capt Crowell Broke and sent into the Warcastle
Edridge a Boat Stewer, for sleeping in his watch on
Deck, when he had charge of the Watch, and for
missing whale, and being insubordinate &c. Latter
part fine saw Porpoises.

steering by the wind to the Eastward. Saw a ship.
Latter part fine at 6 A.M. tacked to the S.W.
