Vine to the E. S. E. Latter part strong wind at 9
A. M. Double reefed and furled the main sail jib and
spanker. at 10 sent down the Mizzen Top sail to repair.

Lat 29-54 Long

Saturday Feb 1st

Begins with strong wind Storing by the Vine to
the E. S. E. Employed repairing the Mizzen Top sail at 6
P. M. sent and put the ship off A. for the Callao
ground. Latter part strong wind course New

Lat 27-18 Long 81-59

Sunday Feb 2nd

Begins with strong Breezes from the E. S. E. course
N. E. by E. saw Porpoises. Latter part strong wind
and the old ship is going it. No whales Whales.

Lat 23-57 Long 81-10

Monday Feb 3rd

Begins with strong wind from the E. S. E. course
N. E. by E. Latter part rather more moderate. One
copper has began to come off.

Lat 20-36 Long 81-03

Tuesday Feb 4th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the E. S. E. course N.
Lat 6 A. M. saw a Orin B. Duck

Lat 17-20 Long 80-39

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Wednesday Feb 5th 1856

Begins with fresh Breezes from the E. S. E. course
N. E. at 3 P. M. saw a Sail. at 6 Shortened sail
and heaved to the wind and set Boats crew
watches. Latter part fine. Storing to. Saw Black
Buck and Grampuses. at 8 A. M. sent the Phil
Gibb to repair.

Lat 16-11 Long 80-20

Thursday Feb 6th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the E. S. E. Storing
by the wind to the Southward. Saw a large
Ship Storing to the Northward. at 4 sent the
Phil Gibb. Lat sent down Shortened sail and
heaved to the E. S. E.

Lat 15-18 Long 80-07

Friday Feb 7th

Begins with fresh Breezes from the E. S. E. Storing
by the wind to the E. S. E. Latter part Storing to by S.
Saw Ship Storing to the Southward.

Lat 15-23 Long 80-00

Saturday Feb 8th

Begins with strong Breezes from the E. S. E. Storing
to by S. at 12:12 heaved to. at 1 raised a whale.
and lowered the Boats. but the whale perceived
something and turned to the windward. at 5 the
Boats returned to the ship. a little after seven
a whale came up close to the ship. we dropped
the Boats down. the S. Boat took two and the
S. Boat took one at 11 set the watch.

Sunday Feb 9th

Begins with moderate Breezes Employed
at 1 P. M. finished and began to clear away the
Decks. at 1 A. M. finished clearing the Decks
and commenced Boiling.
