

Ship. Napoleon. Pacific Ocean. Ballas Ground James A. Crowell Master.

Sunday Feb. 10th 1856

Begins with fresh breezes from the E. S. E. steering by the wind to the Southward. Latter part fine. Employed Boiling. Saw 300 Ducks.

Lat 16-04 Long 81-19

Monday Feb 11

Begins with moderate breezes from the S. E. course N. E. by S. saw a sail steering to the Southward. Latter part fine. at 11 P. M. finished Boiling. Saw 83 fish.

Tuesday Feb 12th

Begins with light breezes and fine weather. Saw Black fish. Latter part fine.

Wednesday Feb 13th

Begins with light breezes from the S. E. steering to the Southward. at 4 P. M. spoke the ship Galmacia Capt. Hunt 110 tons from Marmora. Brought to Ballas with 200 Chinese Passengers, having lost 50 on the passage. Out of bread and flour and other stores. we supplied him with bread flour and vinegar. Latter part fine.

Lat 15-10 Long 82-50

Thursday Feb 14th

Begins with light breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the Southward. Killed a dog. S. S.

Friday Feb 15th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. S. E. Employed coopersing oil at 6 P. M. spoke to the Southward. Latter part Employed stowing down oil.

Saturday Feb 16th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the N. E. Employed stowing oil at 4 P. M. finished stowed down 85 bbls. at 6 took a ship. Latter part strong wind under Double Reef. Saw 83 fish. Lat 16-15

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Sunday Feb. 17th 1856

Begins with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the Southward. at 6 P. M. took to the N. E. Latter part fine. Saw Black fish and Porpoises.

Lat 16-02 Long 81-00

Monday Feb 18th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S. E. at 5 P. M. spoke the ship Cape Horn Captain of Dartmouth Capt. Adams 21 months out 450 bbls. sperm oil. Latter part strong breezes. Employed breaking out shooks and coopersing bread.

Tuesday Feb 19th

Begins with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Saw 300 Ducks and Black fish. at 6 P. M. took to the Eastward. Latter part strong winds.

Lat 16-05

Wednesday Feb 20th

Begins with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the Eastward. we now hoisted braces and bent another fore top sail. Latter part fine saw Black fish. Cooper setting up shooks.

Thursday Feb 21st

Begins with fresh breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. at 4 P. M. spoke and commenced with the Hellen ship 17 months 450 sperm.

Lat 16-11 Long 80-32

Friday Feb 22nd

Begins with strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. at 5 P. M. set well watches. bound for Malacauano.
