Wednesday April 29th 1856

First part light trade. Course N. N. W.
Employed filling main Royal Black Stacks. at
6 P.M. beat the main Royal. at 6 P.M. face
up to, the wind from the Southward.
Latter part light air from the E. S. E. saw
Porpoises. Lat 2-17 Long 82-18

Thursday April 30th

First part light air from the E. S. E. Course
to N. W. Latter part the same. Lat 4-54 Long

Thursday May 1st 1856

First part light air from the Eastward
Course N. N. W. at 2 P.M. saw Woods
Island bearing N. N. E. Dist. 25 miles. at 3 saw
Charles Island and Gardner's bearing N. W.
Dist 25 miles. Latter part light air and baffling
at noon Charles Island bearing N. N. W. Dist 6
miles.

Friday May 2nd

First part light air and baffling from all
Points of the compass. at 6 P.M. Charles Island
bearing E Dist. 8 miles. Middle part light air from
the Westward steering N. N. E. Latter part calm
with a strong N. Westward Current. at 6 A.M.
Boat the Island bearing N. W. Dist 12 miles.
Latter part calm. at noon the Island bearing N. W. Dist
14 miles. we then took a light breeze from
the S. E. just in time to save us trouble.

Saturday May 3rd

First part light breeze from the S. E. headed off shore
to the Southward. Middle part calm. Latter part light
breeze from the Eastward. at South Head bearing
N. by E Dist 12 miles.

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Sunday May 4th 1856

First part pleasant breeze from the S. E. steering
to the Northward down the land. at 4 P.M. Point
Christopher bearing N. E. Dist 3 miles. headed to
the wind headed off shore. at 6 P.M. on the
land bearing E. S. E. Dist 12 miles. at 8 P.M. off
Latter part fresh trades off shore but baffling in.
with the same. we tried to get up in weather but
the wind was too light. at noon Point Christopher
bearing S. by E Dist 6 miles.

Monday May 5th

First part light trade. at 2 P.M. were ship.
ship and strike out of the bar. saw 83 fish
and Porpoises. at 6 P.M. North Head bearing E. N. E.
Dist 6 miles Course N. by W. Latter part calm

Tuesday May 6th

First part calm. spoke the Sapho N. 83 Capt.
Lubin. and saw the sea down building 3 forts
the Mahalis and her 8 boats chasing. Latter part
calm. saw 83 fish, black fish, Porpoises.
at noon Rock Redondo bearing N. E. Dist 5 miles.

Wednesday May 7th

First part calm. 13 hills in sight. at 6 P.M.
the Rock bearing S. E. Dist 3 miles. middle part a light
breeze. Latter part calm

Thursday May 8th

First part calm. 4 hills in sight. Latter part
light breeze from the S. W. saw 83 black fish.
at noon North Head bearing S. E. Dist 12 miles.

Friday May 9th

First part light breeze from the S. W. at 6 P.M. headed
to the N. E. Latter part light air from the
S. E. steering N. E. saw 83 black fish steering the same.
