Saturday May 10th 1856

First part light breeze from the S E steering N E.
Employed a smacking mizen boat rigging.
Middle part calm. Latter part light breezes
from the S E course N E. at 8 P.M. saw Newman's
Island bearing N by E Dist 30 miles, at noon
Lat 2-50

Sunday May 11th

First part light breezes from the S E course
N E. at 6 P.M. the Island bearing N by E
Dist 15 miles. Latter part pleasant breezes.
O where is my dear ones to night.
Lat 2-52

Monday May 12th

First part pleasant breezes from the S E steering
by the wind to the Eastward. Latter part fine
the very strong current setting to the S W
Lat 2-20 Long 90-

Tuesday May 13th

First part pleasant breezes, steering by the
wind to the Eastward. Latter part fresh
breezes.
Lat 2-44 87 47

Wednesday May 14th

First part fresh breezes steering by the wind
to the Eastward. Latter part strong breezes.
Lat 2-55 Long 85-17

Thursday May 15th

First part strong breezes from the Southward
steering by the wind to the E S E. Latter part
strong breezes.

Friday May 16th

First part strong breezes from the S W steering
by the wind to the S E. Latter part light
breezes saw Porpoises.
Lat 3-01 Long 81-32

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Saturday May 17th 1856

First part light breezes from the S W course
E S E. at 2 P.M. raised the anchor. at 6 P.M. Cape
Pasado bearing E S E Dist 30 miles buffed to the wind
to the wind to the S E and shortened sail. Latter
part fine. at 8 A.M. bent the L chain and got the anchor
off the bow. at 4 the Capt went on shore at Cape Pasado
but found it too rough to leave. Lat 3-15
at 10 P.M. were away for Point Salina.

Sunday May 18th

First part pleasant breezes from the S W course
N by E. saw hump backs. Latter part fine
saw the Panama steamer.

Monday May 19th

First part fresh sea breezes from the S W.
at 4 P.M. came to anchor off Point Salina
in 5 fathoms of water. Latter part employed
wooding.

Tuesday May 20th

Fine weather. About 10 hours still running.
at 5 P.M. hoisted up and went off into 8 fathoms
water.

Wednesday May 21st

Fresh breezes from the N.W. and thick and
rain. at noon finished wooding and got a raft
of water. we got the boat load of wood. at 5 got
under way and went to sea. we got some hogs
here and I should like for Lizzie and Leo to see
them. real razor. I heard the B. Series say one
to another this morning while at breakfast, what
is this fresh hog, yes, one of them say, an Indian
Razor hog. I thought it near the truth. I wish
you could have some of our Bananas, we
have about 50 noble bunches. good night
