

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Crowell Master.

Thursday May 22nd 1856

First part sea account fresh breezes from the W. S. W. and rain. at 5 1/2 P. M. took our anchors and went to sea. Latter part fresh breezes steering by the wind to the W. S. W.

Friday May 23rd

First part fresh breezes from the South East steering by the wind to the Westward.

Lat 2-50 Long

Saturday May 24th

First part strong breezes from the South East steering by the wind to the Westward. Saw 1/2 black and caught one. Latter part squally.

Lat 2-37

Sunday May 25th

First part moderate breezes from the South East steering by the wind to the Westward. Latter part fine. Saw a large ship steering to the N. E.

Lat 2-27 Long 86-30

Monday May 26th

First part moderate breezes and baffling steering by the wind to the Westward. at 6 P. M. broke the mainmast of a bark. Capt. McChase, Latter part fine. at 7 1/2 A. M. sent down the main top sail and repaired it. saw two barks.

Tuesday May 27th

First part fresh breezes from the S. W. steering by the wind to the Westward. Employed repairing sails.

Lat 3-30 Long

Wednesday May 28th

First part moderate breezes from the South East steering by the wind to the Westward. Employed repairing sails. Latter part strong breezes

Lat 4-50 Long 92-40

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Thursday May 29th 1856

First part strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. at 5 1/2 P. M. took in top gallant sails and 1/2 top.

Latter part strong winds under double reef.

Employed repairing the main top gallant sail and painting the yards. Lat 1-53 Long 95-00

Friday May 30th

First part strong breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. under double reef. Saw 1/2 black fish and porpoises. Latter part moderate breezes

Lat 0-39 Long 96

Saturday May 31st

First part moderate breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Saw 1/2 fish.

Latter part light breezes Lat 0-10 Long 98-04

Sunday June 1st 1856

First part light breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Latter part light air and calm.

Lat 0-30 Long 99-50

Monday June 2nd 1856

First part part light air from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. a strong westerly current.

Latter part pleasant breezes from the S. E. Lat 1-35 Long 102-30

Tuesday June 3rd

First part pleasant breezes from the S. E. steering by the wind to the S. W. Latter part fine.

Capt. McChase a house to shut the pigs in to dress them. I told him if the folks will shut Frank in a hen coop to wear him. I would like to see them doing it. O Dear me I want to see my Dear ones at home. Lat 2-23 Long 101-55
