Sunday Nov 23rd 1856

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading
S.W. at 1 1/2 P.M. raised whales. the bark
and ship in sight. at 2 1/2 set collours for
whales. and lowered the boats. at 3 1/2 the S boat
struck. killed at 6 1/2 took him to the ship.
I have got a very lame back. I think
some times that I could stay at home content
with a fair living if no more. Latter part
fine. at 6 P.M. commenced Bailing cutting.

Lat 5-25 Long 112-15

Monday Nov 24th
Begins with pleasant breezes from the E.S.E.
Employed cutting. at 1 finished and
began for a new heading S.E. W. saw one
sail. at 1 1/2 P.M. commenced Bailing. Latter
part strong winds Employed Bailing and
and cutting & blubber. Saw a ship.

Lat 5-45 Long 112-55

Tuesday Nov 25th
Begins with strong breezes from the S.E.
heading N.E. by E. Employed Bailing.
Latter part strong winds. Saw a ship to the
Leeward.

Lat 5-26 Long 112-26

Wednesday Nov 26th
Begins with fresh breezes from the E.S.E.
heading N.E. Employed Bailing. at 7 1/2 P.M.
finished, and put on the fire and lean.
Latter part strong breezes. Saw three
ships. One was the Ansel Gibbs, the Others
unknown.

Lat 5-30 Long 111-50

Thursday Nov 27th
Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E.
heading S.W. Latter part fine. At 5 P.M.
tacked to the Southward. Saw the ship Ansel
Gibbs and Philip Delano.

Lat 4-37 Long 111-32

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Friday Nov 28th 1856

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.E.
heading to the Southward. At 5 1/2 P.M. the
Capt. went on board the B. Cummings.
Latter part very fine. Employed Stowing Oil. Saw
a number of sails.

Saturday Nov 29th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the E.S.E.
heading N.E. at 1 P.M. finished Stowing Oil.
Saw a number of sails. Latter part fine.

Lat 5-05

Sunday Nov 30th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the E.S.E.
heading S. Saw one sail. Latter part fine.
Saw 1 ship in back. Lat 5-35 Long 112-38

Monday Dec 1st 1856

Begins with pleasant breezes from the
Eastward. heading to the Northward. Saw a
sail. Latter part squally. Lat 4-45 Long

Tuesday Dec 2nd

Begins with strong winds from the S.E. and
Southward. heading to the E.N.E. Saw two sails
One was the Ansel Gibbs. Latter part strong
winds. at 5 P.M. were ship to the Southward.

Lat 4-33 Long 112-05

Wednesday Dec 3rd

Begins with strong breezes from the S.E.
heading S.W. Saw the bark B. Cummings
to the windward Chasing whales. At 6 P.M.
tacked to the E.N.E. Latter part fresh breezes
at 5 P.M. tacked to the Southward.
