

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Brewster Master.

Monday January 6 1857
Begins with a cold S.W. wind from N.E. by E.
Shave too under Main Top. Main Top. Sail.
and Main Spencer, heading S.E. No ice.
And latter part more moderate, at 1 P.M.
the wind hauled to the westward. Made sail
and steered E.S.E. Lat 32-53 Long 109-54

Tuesday Jan 7th
Begins with strong gales from the
westward. at 10 P.M. the wind hauled
to the S.W. changed the course to E. by S.
latter part squally. Split the fore top sail.
torn and bent another. Lat 34-24 Long 106-52

Wednesday Jan 8th
Begins with fresh S.W. breezes from the N.W.
Course E. by N. saw spuce, middle part light
and baffling breezes, and rain. at 6 P.M. took
a fresh breeze from the N.W. Course E. by N.
all sail set. Sick improving. Lat 34-43 Long 105-28

Thursday Jan 9th
Begins with fresh S.W. breezes from the N.W. at 1
P.M. took in the fore top. Sallant sail
No ice. and latter part fresh breezes and clear
weather. Lat 35-12 Long 100-53

Friday Jan 10th
Begins with fresh S.W. breezes from the N.W. and
clear weather. Steered E. by N. all sail set.
latter part the same. Lat 35-39 Long 96-25

Saturday Jan 11th
Begins with fresh breezes from the N.W. Course
E. by N. & N. 2 days ago to day I was at home with
my wife and sister friends. the visiting desk was well
over hauled. I wonder if I remember it. we sat the
last of my back preserve this night. My good mother and
my friends where are they to night. Lat 35-53 Long 83-32

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Monday January 12th 1857
Begins with light breezes from the westward.
With a heavy westerly swell. Course E. by N. & N.
if we can last yet 3 or more the season, and then
get 600 the next year I hope we shall be able to
come home then. if nothing happens. at 7 P.M.
the wind hauled to the S.E. No ice. latter part
calm. latter part fresh breezes from the S.E.
Lat 35-39 Long 92-01
Tuesday Jan 13th

Begins with fresh breezes from the E.S.E.
saw squally, heading N.E. at 6 P.M. took
in top. Sallant sails. saw Porpoises.
latter part more moderate. Lat 34-14 Long

Wednesday Jan 14th
Begins with moderate breezes from the E.S.E.
heading N.E. Killed our pet. poor dog. he
was a universal favourite, and play fellow. he
knew more than all the dogs I ever saw. he was
raised on board of the ship. too bad. at 7 P.M.
saw a dog. Lat 33-30 Long 88-58

Thursday Jan 15th
Begins with light breezes from the S.E.
the acting E.S.E. employed repairing sails.
latter part took a breeze from the southward.
Course East. Lat 33-06 Long 87-54

Friday Jan 16th
Begins with light breezes from the
southward course E. latter part calm.
repairing sails. two years ago this evening I
was at home. got sitting by that table
that I have passed so many happy hours by.
Lat 33-20 Long 86-20
