Thursday Feb 19th 1857
fresh & breezes from the southward

Friday Feb 20th
Strong & breezes from the southward

Saturday Feb 21st
Strong & breezes from the southward.

Sunday Feb 22^d
Fine weather breeze from the southward. A watch
on liberty.

Monday Feb 23^d
Fresh breezes from the southward; at 10^{1/2} P.M.
took our anchor and went to sea.

Tuesday Feb 24th
Began with fresh breezes from southward, course
N.W. Latter part fresh breezes.

Wednesday Feb 25th
Fresh breezes from the S.E. course
N.W. saw 1st & 2^d backs. At 3 P.M. changed
the course to N.N.W. Latter part pleasant
breezes from the S.E. course N.W. saw
Black fish. Lat 33-40 Long

Thursday Feb 26th
First part fresh breezes from the S.E.
course N.W. saw Black fish.
Latter moderate breezes. Employed repairing
sail. Lat 28-52

Friday Feb 27th
First part fresh breezes from the S.E.
course N.W. Latter part moderate.
Lat 26-40 Long 74-30

Saturday Feb 28th 1857
First part moderate breezes from the
S.E. course N.W. Latter part light
breezes. Saw Porpoises.

Sunday March 1st 1857
First part moderate breezes. Course N.E.
at 6 changed the course N.W. and took
in light sails. Latter part fine. Saw
Porpoises and one 1st & 2^d back. Took quite
sick with pleurisy. Lat 23-33

Monday March 2^d
First part pleasant breezes from the
southward. Steering N.E. saw a sail, and
a plenty of Porpoises. Lat 22-32 Long

Tuesday March 3^d
First part pleasant breezes from the southward.
course N.E. at 6 shortened sail and steered
N.N.W. Latter part light airs. Saw Grampuses.
Land in sight Dist 35 miles.

Wednesday March 4th
First part light airs from the southward
course N.N.W. at 5 changed it to N.W. by N.
Latter part light airs. Saw 1st & 2^d back. and
one sail. Land in sight Dist 60 miles. Lat 21-05

Thursday March 5th
First part light breezes from the S.E. course
N.W. at 6 P.M. shortened sail and steered N.W.
at 9^{1/2} P.M. the cook Robert Brown died. his
complaint had the appearance of the pleurisy. At 11^{1/2}
P.M. buried him in his watery grave. A solemn sight
on ship board, to see a ship mate buried.
