Friday March 6th 1857

First part light breezes from the S.E. course to. Latter part light breezes, saw a dark steering to the Westward.

Saturday March 7th

Light breezes from the S.E. steering N. saw a sail. Latter part fine course to S.W. saw black fish and porpoises. Lat 11-58 Long 73-03

Sunday March 8th

First part light breezes from the S.E. course to by N. at 7 A.M. broke the chronometer in winding. we have now to run by watch. Lat 18-01 Long 74-46

Monday March 9th

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E. course to by N. saw juncos and a sail steering N.W. Lat 17-11 Long 76-30

Tuesday March 10th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.W. course to by N. Latter part fine. Lat 16-08 Long 78-06

Wednesday March 11th

Begins with pleasant breezes from S.E. course to by N. Latter part fine saw skin backs. Lat 15-13 Long 79-42

Thursday March 12th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.E. course to by N. Latter part fresh breezes. saw skin backs and juncos. Lat 14-11 Long 82-02

Friday March 13th

Begins with strong winds from the S.W. course to by N. Latter part fresh breezes. Lat 11-55 Long 81-58

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Saturday March 14th 1857

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E. course to by N. Latter part fine saw skin backs. course S.W. Lat 9-35 Long 81-50

Sunday March 15th

Begins with moderate breezes from the S.E. course to by N. at 6 P.M. shortened sail and steered N.W. Latter part pleasant breezes from the Westward, steering N. saw skin fish. Lat 7-38 Long 82-19

Monday March 16th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the Eastward steering N.N.E. at 6 P.M. shortened sail, Latter part fine breezes from the S.W. heading by the wind to the N.E. saw skin fish. Dist Lat 6-12 Long by watch 81-24-82-10

Tuesday March 17th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.E. heading by the wind to the S.W. at 6 P.M. shortened sail. Latter part fine. at 9 A.M. raised Parta Head bearing E 1/2 S Dist 50 miles saw skin and hump backs. Lat 5-12

Wednesday March 18th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.W. at 1 lowered for skin fish, the skin boat struck and took care to the ship. at 6 P.M. shortened sail. Parta Head bearing E by N. Dist 15 miles. at 11 A.M. the Capt. went on shore for a chronometer.

Thursday March 19th

First part fresh sea breezes. at 3 P.M. the skin boat came on board without the Capt. we stood out of the Bay for the night. at 11 A.M. returned and sent the skin boat ashore for the Capt.
