

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Crowell Master.

Friday March 26th 1857

First part fresh breezes from the S.W.
Off and on at night. At 1 P.M. the
captain came on board with a chronometer.
We then braced forward and stood out
to sea. At 11 P.M. raised sperm whales
lowered the 83 Boat struck. Lat 4-35 Long 87-00
B.B.

Saturday March 27th

First part fresh breezes from the S.W.
At 2 P.M. took the whale to the ship. At 3 1/2
commenced cutting. Latter part fine employed
cutting.

Sunday March 28th

First part pleasant breezes. At 2 P.M.
finished cutting. At 6 commenced boiling.
Latter part fine. Employed cutting blubber and
boiling. Saw Min Backs.

Monday March 29th

First part fine. heading by to the southward
Employed boiling. Saw Min Backs. At 6
P.M. wore to the N.E. Latter part fine

Tuesday March 30th

First part fine breezes from the E.S.E.
heading N.E. saw Min Backs. At 7 P.M.
finished boiling. the whale turned up
in B.B. Saw Black fish. Lat 3-10 Long 87-00

Wednesday March 31st

First part light breezes from the
E.S.E. heading N.E. saw 83 fish. Latter
part fine. Employed setting up Pipe Shacks.

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Thursday March 26th 1857

First part pleasant breezes from the S.E. steering
by the wind to the eastward. Saw 83 fish.
Latter part fine. at 5 1/2 A.M. tacked to the S.W.

Friday March 27th

First part pleasant breezes from the S.E.
steering N.W. saw 83 Black fish. At 6 P.M.
tacked to the wind heading E by S.
Latter part fine. Employed Stowing Oil

Saturday March 28th

First part light breezes from the S.E.
course N.W. at 6 P.M. finished stowing
oil and washing off. Stowed 95 B.Bs.
Latter part fine. Saw 83 fish and jumpers. Course
to. Lat 3-27 Long 85-18

Sunday March 29th

First part pleasant breezes from the S.W.
course N.W. Latter part fine. Saw Porpoises
Lat 3-00 Long 87-09

Monday March 30th

First part pleasant breezes from the
S.W. course S.W. at 6 P.M. tacked too heading
E.N.E. saw Porpoises. Latter part fine
course N. Lat 1-42 Long 87-00

Tuesday March 31st

First part pleasant breezes from the
S.E. course N. at 6 P.M. changed it to N.W.
Latter part fine. Lat 1-16 Long 88-28

Wednesday March April 1st 1857

First part fine breezes from the E.S.E. course
N.W. at 4 P.M. lowered for 83 fish. the
83 Boat struck and took care to the
ship. Latter part Stowing S.W. Boiling
83 fish.
