Tuesday April 14<sup>th</sup> 1857  
Begins with light and baffling breezes from the Eastward. Heading to the Northward. Latter part fine. at 1 A.M. tacked to the Southward. Saw Chin Rocks.  
Lat 5-01 Long 104-06

Wednesday April 15<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with light breezes and fine weather. heading to the Southward. at 6 P.M. tacked to the Eastward. Latter part pleasant breezes Saw Porpoises.  
Lat 5-01 Long

Thursday April 16<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with fresh breeze from the S.E. heading E.S.E. Saw Chin Back. at 6 P.M. took in (Mizzen) sails. Latter part fine at 5 1/2 A.M. tacked to the S.W.  
Lat 4-36 Long 103-06

Friday April 17<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.W. by S. heading S.W. by S. Saw Squid. Latter part fine at 1 P.M. wore ship to the E.N.E. Saw Porpoises. Lat 4-49 Long 103-45

Saturday April 18<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with pleasant breezes from the S.E. heading E.N.E. Latter part fine. at 1 P.M. tacked to the Southward. Saw Squid. Lat 4-56 Long 104-28

Sunday April 19<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with pleasant breezes from the E.S.E. heading to the Southward. Saw Squid. Latter part strong breezes from the S.E. at 5 1/2 A.M. tacked to the E.S.E.  
Lat 5-24 Long

Monday April 20<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with strong winds from the S.E. heading E.S.E. at 6 P.M. Double Reefed the Main and Mizzen (Mizzen) sails. Latter part strong winds.  
Lat 4-50 Long 103-49

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Tuesday April 21<sup>st</sup> 1857  
Begins with strong breezes from the S.E. heading E.N.E. at 6 P.M. Double Reefed. Latter part fresh breezes. at 1 P.M. wore ship to the Southward. Saw Chin Rocks. Repaired the Mizzen (Mizzen) Sallant sail. I am not very well. there is something in my Breast that is not right. my food distresses me often. with an inclination to cough. my Breast is sore with cut hairs in my sides and pit of my Stomach. I know not what it is but fear it is the commencement of declining health. The first I felt of it was last Cruise after a severe spell of the Panker. Lat 4-46 Long 103-42

Wednesday April 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading to the Southward. at 1 A.M. tacked to the N.E. Saw a sail steering to the Northward. Saw Chin Back.  
Lat 5-07 Long 103-55

Thursday April 23<sup>rd</sup>  
Begins with fresh breezes and some squalls. at 6 P.M. shortened sail. Saw Squid. Latter part moderate breezes from the E.S.E. at 5 1/2 wore ship to the Southward.

Friday April 24<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with moderate breezes from the E.S.E. heading to the Southward. Latter part light breezes from Eastward heading N.E.

Saturday April 25<sup>th</sup>  
Begins with light breezes from the Eastward heading N.E. Saw Squid. Latter part fine. at 2 A.M. wore ship to the Southward.  
Lat 5-01 Long
